

Katharine Hepburn, Spencer Tracy Teamed In Ohio Film

"Woman Of The Year" Will Open On Saturday; Fay Bainter And Reginald Owen Featured In Supporting Cast

The problem of the "career woman" is given refreshing treatment in the new photoplay, "Woman of the Year," which opens Saturday at the Ohio theatre with Spencer Tracy and Katharine Hepburn in the leading roles. Also in the cast in prominent roles are Fay Bainter and Reginald Owen. Showing for the last time Friday is "Paris Calling," starring Elizabeth Bergner and Randolph Scott.

Claudette Colbert heads in this picture the cast of the forthcoming attraction, "Remember the Day," commencing with a Friday preview showing at the Quilna theatre. John Payne has the male lead in the film which concerns the hidden love story of a woman's life, while John Sheppard also deals a hand in her romantic life. Showing for the last time Friday are "Three Girls About Town" and "The Officer and the Lady."

For thrills, action and excitement, "Wild Bill Hickok Rides," commencing Saturday at the Sigma theatre, would be hard to beat. The cast includes Constance Bennett, Bruce Cabot, Warren Williams and Walter Catlett. Co-featured will be "All-American Co-Ed," starring Frances Langford, Johnny Davis, Marjorie Woodworth and Noah Beery, Jr. Showing for the last time Friday are "Mr. and Mrs. North" and "Sons of the Sea."

Gene Autry is the dating adventurer, "Cowboy Serenade," with Smiley Burnette and Fay McKenzie, comedian and heroine, respectively. Another exciting chapter in the life of a famous character is unveiled in the co-feature, "Mr. District Attorney and the Carter Case," with James Ellison and Virginia Gilmore sharing starring roles.

"Wild Bill Hickok Rides," a thundering drama of the old west, will be the next attraction at the Sigma theatre, starting Saturday. Bruce Cabot is starred in the title role of the heroic marshal who did so much to bring law and order to our frontier towns. Co-starring with him is Constance Bennett, in the role of a gambling house owner, and Warren Williams as the suaveest crook of frontier days. Also featured are Betty Brewer, Walter Catlett and many others.

The story of "Wild Bill Hickok Rides" concerns itself with the efforts of one Farrell (Warren Williams) to get control of the cattle country around Powder River, Montana. Farrell, a Chicagoan, persuades beautiful Belle Andrews to go with him when her gambling house is burned in the great Chicago fire. On the train, she meets and has cause to admire Wild Bill Hickok, who is also going to the Powder River country where his ward, a little girl, is living with a friend of his who owns the key ranch there.

Farrell's plans to get control work out well, until he comes to the ranch owned by Hickok's friend. There is a large mortgage on it, but it isn't yet due. So Farrell does his worst, gets the rancher of a framed murder charge. Hickok, Hickok goes after the one witness who can clear his friend, but meanwhile Farrell's stooges lynch the rancher.

Contraire over what has taken place, Belle goes to Hickok to offer him her help, telling him that Farrell is buying up the note on the ranch. Hickok calls a meeting of all the ranchers, and they decide to sell their cattle and get enough money to pay off the note. When Farrell gets wind of the plan, he plots to blow up the town just above the valley where the cattle have been rounded up. Belle rushes to Hickok with the warning, and in a powerful climatic scene Hickok rushes to the rescue and makes Farrell pay with his life for his villainy.

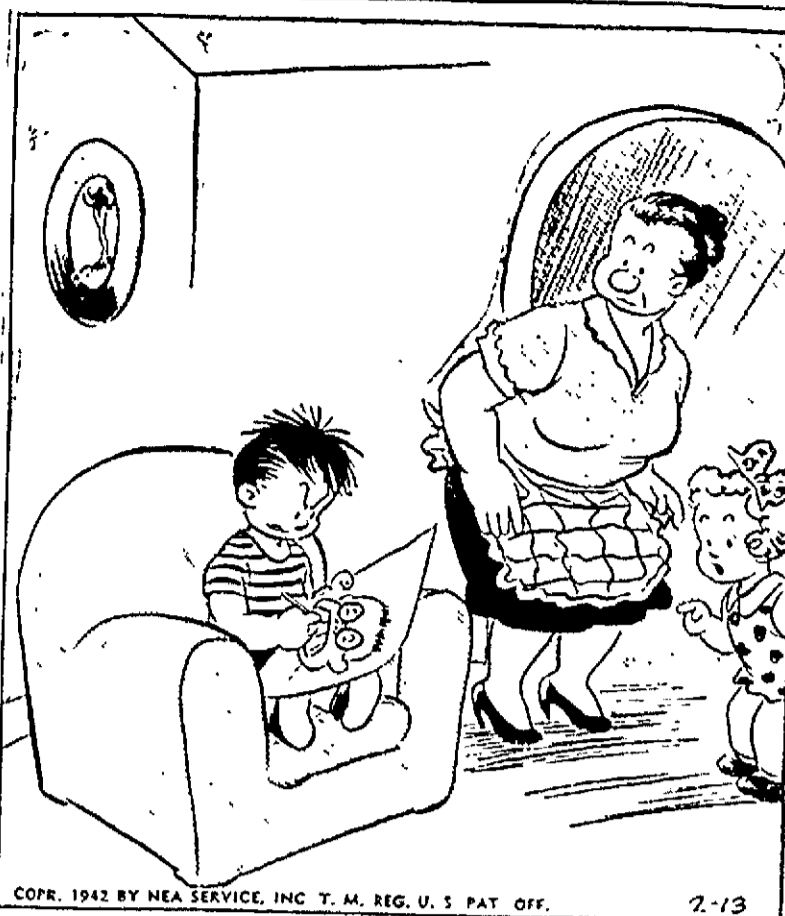
As action director, Ray Enright, guided the production, and Charles Grayson, Paul Gerard Smith and Raymond Schrock wrote the original screen play.

Appearing in roles especially written for them, Spencer Tracy and Katharine Hepburn co-star in "Woman of the Year," which opens Saturday at the Ohio theatre.

This is their first co-starring picture, and Miss Hepburn's initial film since "The Philadelphia Story." Tracy appears as a hardboiled New York sports writer and Miss Hepburn is a sophisticated international columnist on the staff of the same daily. The story was written by Ring Lardner, Jr., and Michael Kama, met the favor of Miss Hepburn, and was purchased by Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer, who produced "The Philadelphia Story."

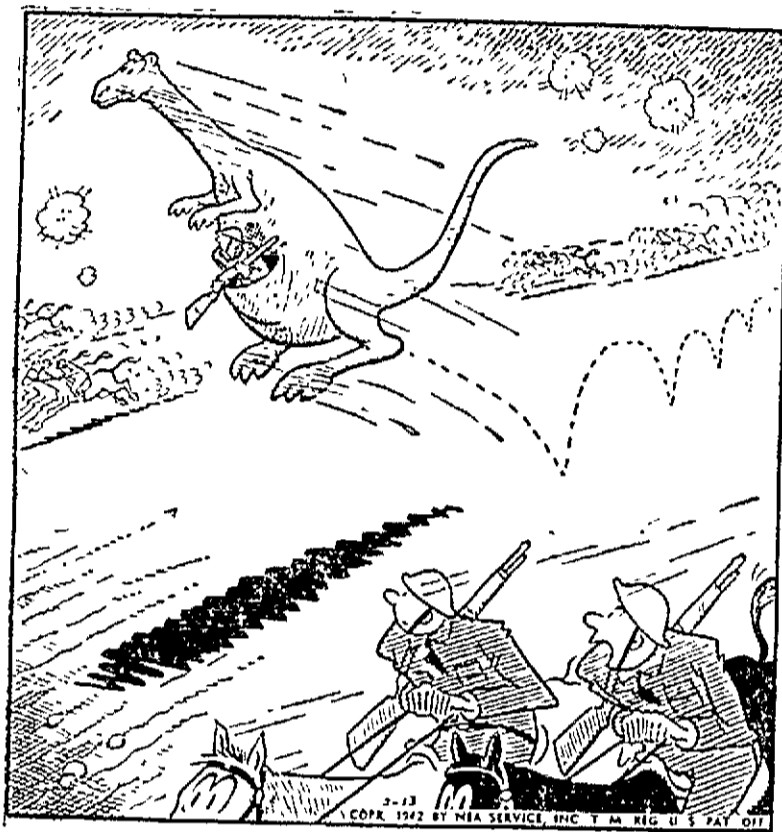
The romance is played against humorous backgrounds. Until she meets Tracy in the picture, Miss Hepburn has never seen a baseball game or a football match. In his
