

Cagney And Brenda Marshall Are Teamed In New Ohio Hit

"Captain Of The Clouds" Due To Open Saturday; Great Hilarity Promised Fans In Quilna's Attraction

That mighty mite, James Cagney, arrives now in a role as you really like him. He's full of blood and thunder action, great storm and strife in "Captain of the Clouds" that commences Saturday at the Ohio theatre. Assisting the terrific Cagney is Brenda Marshall. The film has the ultimate in appeal, for besides having both these great stars it is executed in technicolor.

Great hilarity reigns on the Quilna silver screen. That Spanish wiggle-worm, Lupe Velez, does hula dances and otherwise ingratiates herself into the navy-movie-goers hearts, etc., in "Honolulu Lu," the first one of the previewed attractions Friday evening. "Go West, Young Lady" also centers around the caprices of the eternal feminine.

That old bromide about woman's place being in the home gets a good going over in "Woman of the Year," the picture now seable for last times today at the Ohio theatre. Katharine Hepburn plays the role of a smart and sassy columnist who is loved by Spencer Tracy, a sports writer. The dialogue is very "Philadelphia Story"—and that's something.

All lovers of mystery and high crime will go for "The Gay Falcon" in a major manner. George Sanders plays the role of a smooth talking and neat love-making expert, also having considerable talent along criminal lines. This picture is at the State theatre. Likewise showing is "Appointment For Love," a deft bit of romance.

With Spencer Tracy playing a sports writer, a gentleman of the press will be portrayed legitimately on the screen for the first time. This is a new and interesting characterization for the two-time Academy Award winner in "Woman of the Year," co-starring Katharine Hepburn and showing at the Ohio theatre for the last times Friday.

For years, motion picture audiences received an impression of newspapermen that made those in the profession cringe. The reason for this undoubtedly, is that newspaper stories invariably were laid during the exciting roaring twenties, the era of prohibition, gangsterism and two-fisted police reporters. The newspapermen depicted were a product of their time.

Both the characters and newspaper backgrounds of the new film are modern and up-to-date. Tracy's sports writer and the international columnist played by Miss Hepburn were patterned after well known figures in the newspaper world of today, men and women who have earned distinction for their brilliant reporting.

George Stevens directed the picture. Ring Lardner, Jr. and Michael Kanin wrote the story especially for Miss Hepburn, and she agreed to play the title role providing Tracy co-starred.

The program is radio's oldest sponsored network series, having made its bow way back on Feb. 18, 1927.

Featured number by the ensemble is to be a medley of the music of the most-requested composer in the show's history—Victor Herbert.

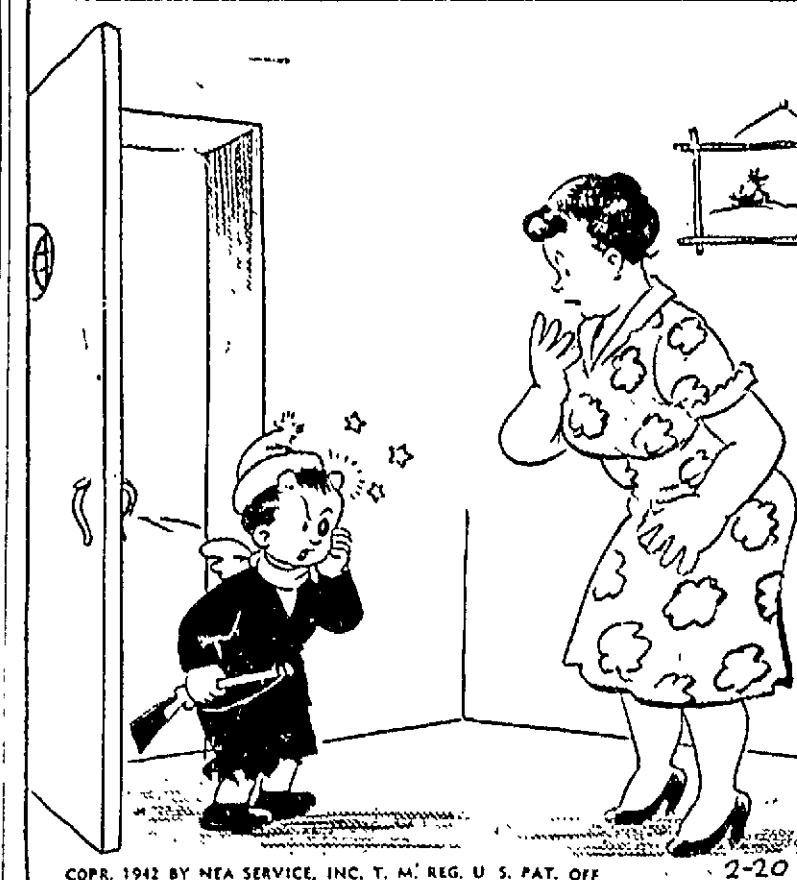
