Lupe Velez, Leo Carrillo, Ruggles, James Cagney Are Featured In Film

A pair of snappy films spotlight the program of the Quilna theatre where "Honolulu Lu" and "Go West, Young Lady" are the current features. But a few days before the fight Conn is accidentally involved in a scrape with an underworld character while in the company of Babs Ellison, lovely daughter of a rival manager. Pat rescues him, but believing him to be in love with Babs, sells his contract and refuses to see him again.

Conn takes a pasting in the early rounds of the fight, and it is obvious he needs Pat's coaching in order to win. And Babs, who is really in love with the young fighter, is the only one who can locate Pat.

On Babs' momentous decision depend all the climatic sequences which make "The Pittsburgh Kid," a colorful and thrill-packed production which provides Entertainment with a big "E."

Considering Conn's newness to the screen, his performance deserves bravos. He has a personality and self-assurance which should take him far as an actor. Jean Parker makes an able presentation of the "Pat Mallory" role, while Veda Ann Borg follows thru admirably as the blondly beautiful "Babs Ellison." Dick Purcell, Alan Baxter, and Johnathan Hale are excellent in lesser roles.
