of Wisconsin is featuring one of its fine collections of portraits each week at its library on the University of Wisconsin campus. The paintings portray men and women whose personalities have had much influence on Wisconsin.

"Speak to a cow as you would to a lady," was one of the farm axioms that William Dempster Hoard made popular throughout Wisconsin and the nation. It shows both his enthusiasm for dairy farming and his homely, Lincolnesque sense of humor.

Hoard, who was born and raised in New York state as the son of a Methodist circuit rider, become interested in dairying at 16. In 1857 he moved to consin, for a time was a Methodist exhorter, and then taught singing schools throughout the southern part of the state. He was married to Agness Elizabeth Bragg of Lake Mills in 1860.

Returns to State

After serving in the Civil war, Hoard returned to Columbus, but failed to make a go of a hop business there. In 1870 he founded a weekly newspaper, the Jefferson County Union, at Lake Mills. In agricultural journalism he discovered his life work, the selling of dairying to farmers who were trying to wring a living from wheat-weary soil. Hoard's Dairyman, established at Ft. Atkinson in 1885, grew to have world-wide influence.

Hoard's hand is seen in nearly every improvement in Wisconsin agriculture for 40 years - the forming of dairymen's associa-tions; the dairy school set up at the University of Wisconsin; and the use of alfalfa, the tuberculin test for cattle, and the silo.

Elected Governor

Hoard was elected governor of Wisconsin by the Republicans in 1888 as the "Jersey cow candidate." He helped draw the Bennett aw, which required instruction in the English language to be given in the elementary schools. Ger-man Lutherans and Catholics thought this law directed against their parochial schools and in the resulting furor Hoard was defeated for a second term in 1890, and Wisconsin voted for Grover Cleveland in 1892.


