An estimated \$3,000.000 could be spent thruout the country during fiscal '43 barring curtailment of the program because of the war,

said the report. The acreage eyed by the forest service does not by any means include all the forest lands in Ohio. The total is 4,662,000 acres. The portion included in the purchase program is in the areas of the Hocking Valley, Little Scioto, Mc-Arthur, Muskingum and Symmes Creek forests.




