The story is as timely as this morning's front page. Young has the title role as a steady, unassuming worker in an aircraft factory. Marsha Hunt is his wife, and ten-year-old Darryl Hickman portrays his son.

They are symbolic of the average young American family. Young is detailed to work on a secret bomb sight which draws the attention of four enemy agents. He is kidnapped and tortured, but refuses to divulge the secret mechanism. His escape by a dramatic ruse is logical and his swift memory serves to capture the gang in a brilliant climax.

Blindfolded while his prisoner, he remembers what little he can see below the bandage. An ink spot on a shoe, a finger ring, a scratch on a door and a broken hub cap on an automobile, all serve to lead the federal sleuths to the haunt of their quarry.

By a clever feat of photography, the audience is permitted to see only what Young can vision beneath his blindfold. The figures of his enemies are shown either below the knees, or merely in indistinguishable shadows.

The gangsters are well portrayed by Jonathan Hale, Noel Madison, Don Costello and Joseph Anthony. Harvey Stephens and William Forrest are excellent as federal detectives.

"Frisco Lil" a new adventure drama of life behind the scenes in a swank gambling rendezvous, with Irene Hervey in the title role, is the co-feature attraction at the Sigma theatre beginning Wednesday.

Kent Taylor appears opposite Miss Hervey in the role of a young law instructor, while the supporting cast includes such well known players as Jerome Cowan, Minor Watson, Samuel S. Hinds and Claire Whitney.

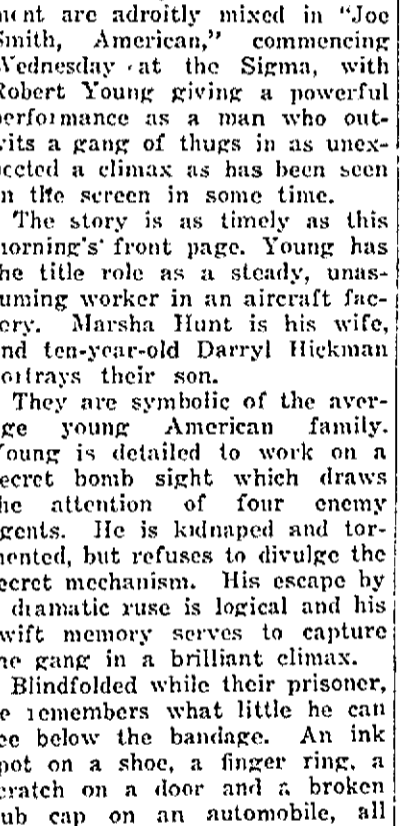

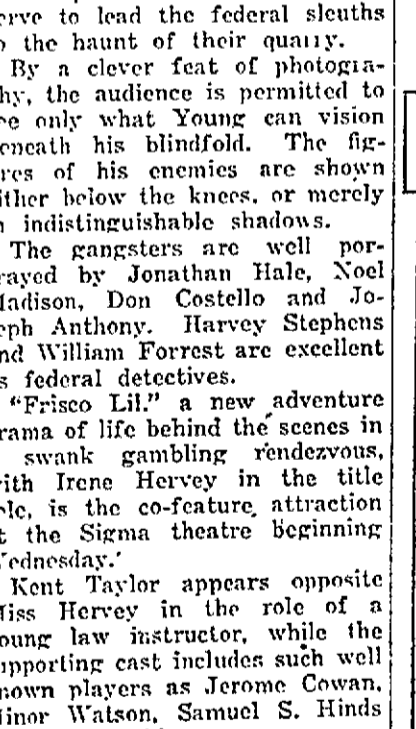

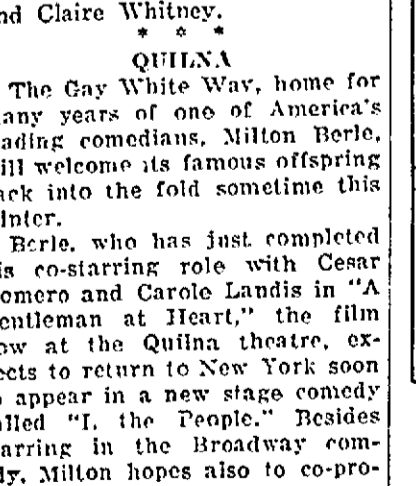
