### Double Comic Feature Showing At Quilna; Ohio Offers Comedy Pair With Rooney-Garland At State

The love story of a manly grasshopper and a cute, cuddly bee, told in a Technicolor feature-length cartoon, and other little people of the insect world, are featured in the film, "Mr. Bug Goes To Town," commencing Wednesday at the Sigma theatre. 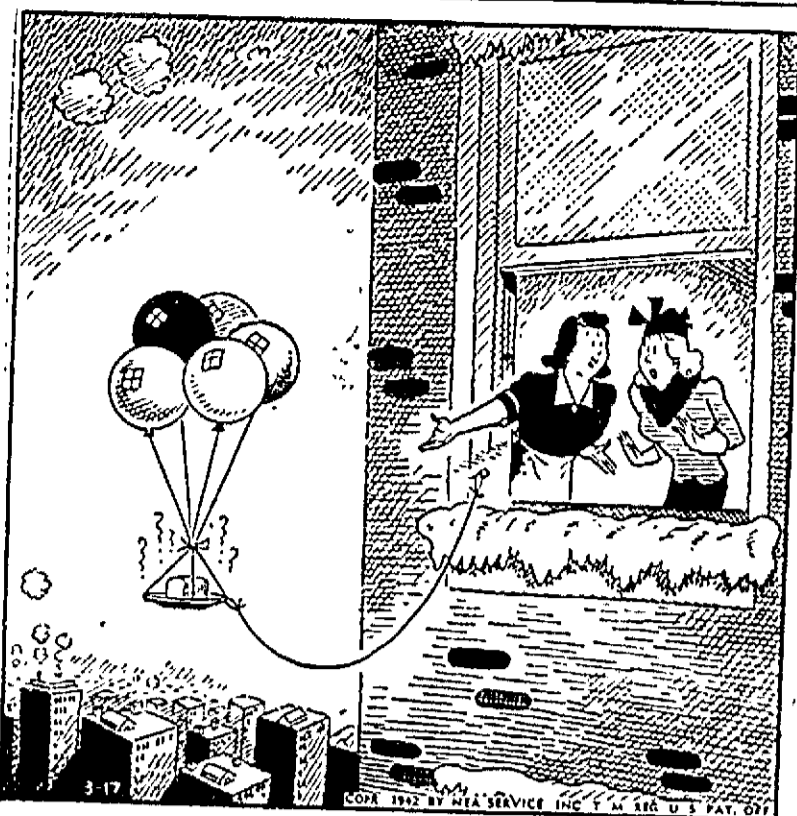

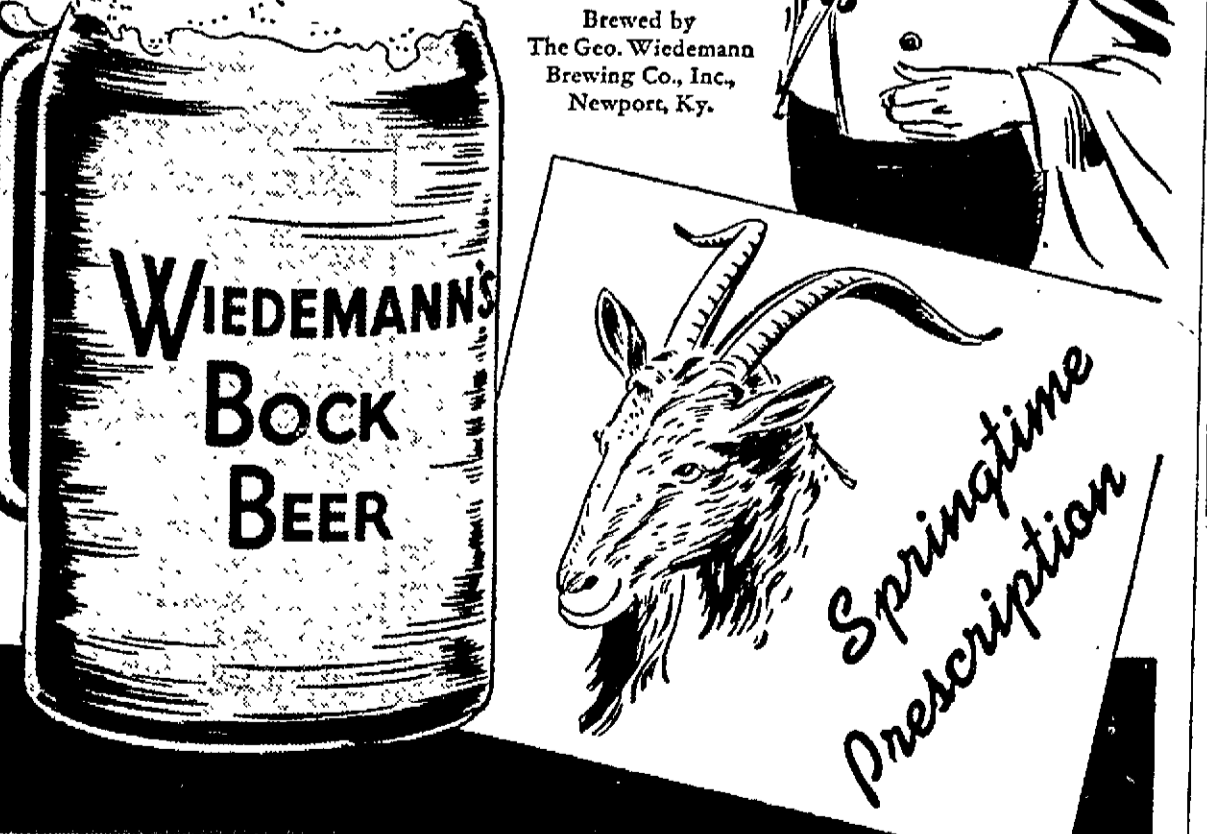
