

U. S. Raid On Jap Islands To Be Dramatized On Broadcast

March Of Time Will Reenact Daring Undertaking Friday Night; Berlin Numbers Will Feature Concert Program

March of Time Friday will re-enact the daring raid by a task force of the U. S. Pacific fleet on Japan's fortified Gilbert and Marshall Islands, an offensive that has been described as "a blueprint for victory." Titled "U. S. Navy in Action" and based on experiences of Life Cameraman Robert Landry, who photographed the attack and has just returned to New York with a first-hand report, the program will be aired over WJZ at 9:30 p. m.

Going "on scene" in the distant Pacific with an exciting dramatization of life aboard an American destroyer steaming into battle with the enemy, March of Time will give listeners a vivid understanding of the type of offensive action the United States must undertake on a grand scale to win the war.

Selections from Irving Berlin's "Louisiana Purchase" will be featured on the concert under Dr. Frank Black's baton, Friday, at 8:00 p. m. over WEAF.

Lucille Manners' soprano solos are "Senora" by Nathan and "Beautiful Lady" by Caryll's "Pink Lady"; Ross Graham sings "Hills of Home" by Fox; the orchestra plays Kreisler's "Tambourin Chinois," and the ensemble rounds out the show with "For No Rhyme or Reason" by Cole Porter.

PREMIERS STAGE VERBAL TILT

Appointment Of Casey Follows Exchange Between Churchill, Curtin

CANBERRA, March 20—(INS)—The unprecedented appointment of Richard G. Casey to the British war cabinet came after a verbal battle via cable between Prime Minister Winston Churchill and Australia's prime minister, John Curtin, it was disclosed today by Curtin himself.

In a "white paper," which he will present to the Australian parliament next Wednesday, Curtin March 22, asking permission to name Casey minister of state in the Middle East on the war cabinet.

Curtin replied, requesting Churchill not to approach Casey, feeling that Casey should remain in Washington as Australian minister to the United States, he said. Churchill then sent Curtin a message saying he had talked with Casey during his visit in the United States and the envoy had
