# Schools Fail Student Needs

#### Professor Urges Curriculum Change

CHICAGO —(U.P.)— Prof. Wil-ford M. Alkin of Ohio State Uni-versity asserted today that the naion's high schools, by clinging to raditional study programs, were ailing to meet the needs of their

10,000,000 students.
Aikin charged high schools vere neglecting students who do not expect to attend colleges. He urged high schools to discard their traditional curriculum and colleges to abandon their credit

and admission requirements.

Aikin spoke at a session of the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, the nation's largest organization setting standards for educational in-stitutions. He told how students in 30 selected high schools had been released from the standard requirements for college entrance. The schools attempted to "lead their students into the fullest possible appreciation and understanding of their American heritage

and to give them abundant experience in democratic living in Aikin explained that "artificial barriers" between subjects were eliminated and courses such as the "study of modern culture" were






