300 Men Return to Manitowoc Ship Yards After Strike

MILWAUKEE -(U.P)- Three undred building tradesmen were to return to their jobs today with the Manitowoc Ship Building Co., after ending a strike which began Wednesday over demands for wage increases. Maj. James P. Holmes, resident

conciliator of the War Produc-tion labor conciliation service at Milwaukee, was sent to arrange settlement negotiations Friday after union and company representatives had reached a stalemate.

The workers asked for a wage increase of 10 cents an hour. Agreement was reached providing for an increase of five cents an hour now and an additional five cent increase effective July 1.

E. W. Beggs, authority on light

sources that activate phosphoresand fluorescent pigments, cent said that the new type of paint, which glows in the dark like moonlight, may find important peace - time uses. In its war-time uses, the paint can perform important services, Beggs said.

"Under war conditions," he said "walls of light could be incalcul-ably valuable in the dark holds of ships, in air-raid shelters, in industrial plants, or wherever a sud-den power failure, might leave persons groping blindly in the dark.

Paint Stores Light

"The use of such paints could help save lives in emergencies, since persons could see well enough to get to places of safety.' Quantity production of phosphorescent paint upon conclusion of the war would make it available for homes, offices, industrial plants, and ther establishments where the walls, floors, and furnishings could be coated with the substance, Beggs said. Beggs explained that the paint

composed of mineral substances which act like storage batteries, storing up quantities of light from the sun or any artificial source.




