300 Men Return to Manitowoc Ship Yards After Strike

MILWAUKEE (U.P.)—Three hundred building tradesmen were to return to their jobs today with the Manitowoc Ship Building Co., after ending a strike which began Wednesday over demands for wage increases.

Maj. James P. Holmes, resident conciliator of the War Production labor conciliation service at Milwaukee, was sent to arrange settlement negotiations Friday after union and company representatives had reached a stalemate.

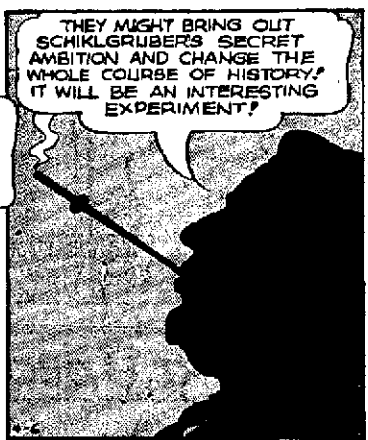
The workers asked for a wage increase of 10 cents an hour. Agreement was reached providing for an increase of five cents an hour now and an additional five cent increase effective July 1.

The pool's formation was announced Sunday night when the presidents of the companies made public a telegram to Donald M. Nelson, chairman of the war production board, offering their joint services "as a regional planning, coordinating, and advisory committee on aircraft production problems to further assist you and the armed forces."
