

Ann Corio Holds Lead Position In "Swamp Woman" At Lyric

State Offers Adventure Film With Fairbanks, Jr.; Story Of College Girl Featured At Ohio

Ann Corio, who has one of the best exhibits seen on Broadway, is the star of the film commencing Monday at the Lyric theatre, "Swamp Woman." It is the story of two women of the swamplands of southern Georgia, one a former honky tonk dancer returning to her home after a career as dancer. Co-featured is "Confessions of a Model."

Currently at the State theatre is "The Corsican Brothers," starring Douglas Fairbanks, Jr., Ruth Warrick and Akim Tamiroff in one of the better known adventure stories of Alexander Dumas. Fairbanks has the dual role of twin brothers in the film. Co-featured is "Melody Lane," starring the Merry Macs, Leon Errol and Baby Sandy.

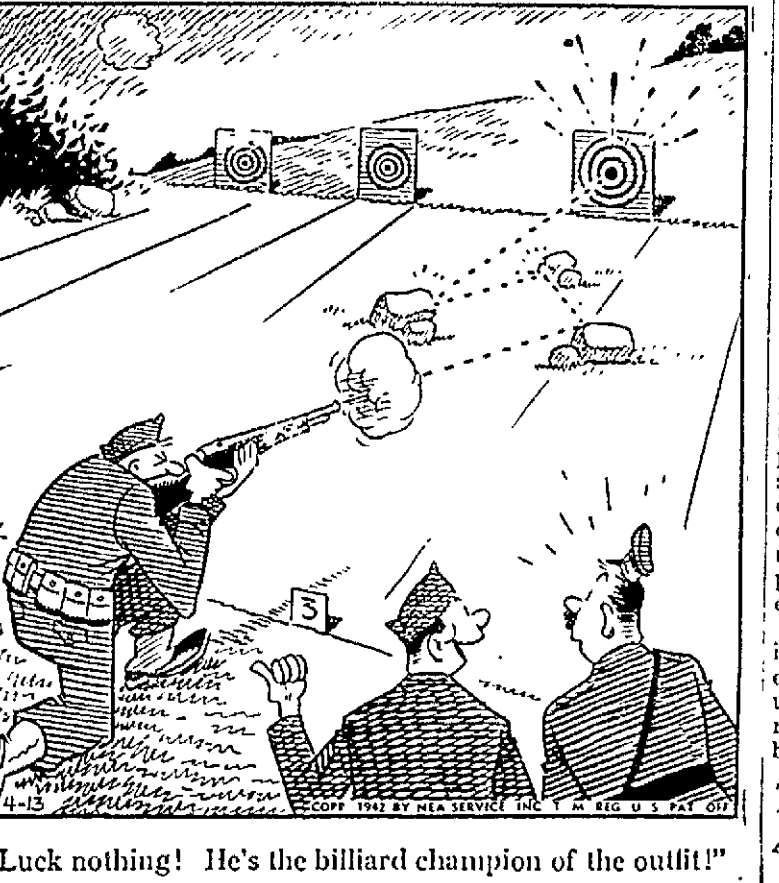

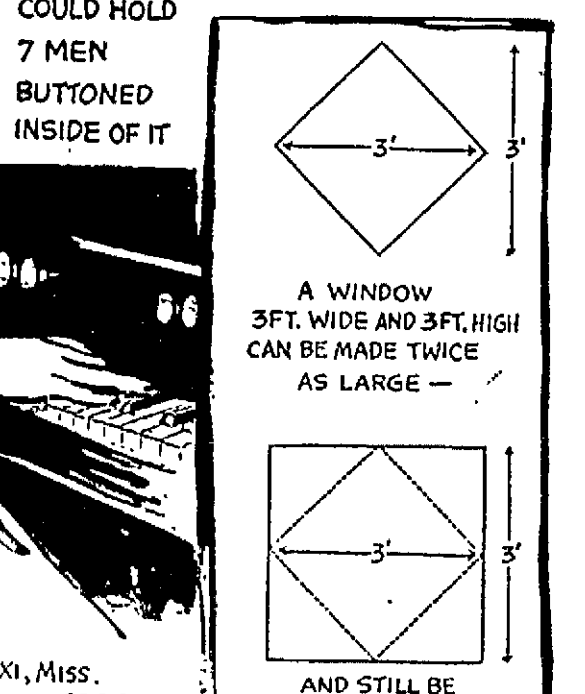
FEBRUARY 1942 calendar grid showing days of the week and dates from 1 to 28.

OHIO SALES TAX INCOME SLUMPS HALF A MILLION IN THREE-MONTH PERIOD

COLUMBUS, O., April 13 — (AP)—Revenues from Ohio's 3 per cent retail sales tax slumped about a half million dollars below the first quarter of 1942 from the same period in 1941, a report showed today. Feeling the first effects of wartime buying curtailments, the state saw its first quarter's sales tax receipts drop to \$11,598,552, a loss of \$483,991 from last year. Most of the loss occurred during the four weeks ended March 28 when revenues totaled only \$3,975,028, a dip of \$181,765 from the comparable period last year. The Bricker administration an-

TWO FRENCHMEN ARE EXECUTED

VICHY, April 13—(INS)—The execution by German authorities of Lieutenant Rene Caron and Sergeant Emile Mollet, of the French army, was disclosed in Vichy today. Both were shot. The French soldiers were convicted by the Nazis of ordering the execution, at Abbeville in May, 1940, of 21 German, Italian, Belgian and Dutch prisoners. It was charged that the group of prisoners had been arrested in Belgium and transferred to France during the Allied retreat.

DELPHOS CITED FOR SAFETY IN AUTO TRAFFIC

(Lima News Bureau) DELPHOS, April 13 — For the second time the city of Delphos has been cited by the Ohio Traffic Safety Council for having no traffic fatalities over a year's period. The first time the city was awarded a plaque for its record. For the year 1941, the municipality has been selected for honorable mention and will be given a certificate at the annual meeting of the council at Cleveland May 15. Announcement of the award was made in a communication received from Elliot Ness, Cleveland safety director and general chairman of the Ohio Traffic Safety Council, by Mayor W. D. Swihart. Judges making the selection with Ness were Roy H. Williams, judge of the Ohio supreme court; Lee E. Skeel, judge of the Eighth judicial district, court of appeals; Harry E. Neal of Columbus, and A. F. Whitney of Cleveland. It is expected that Mayor Swihart and other municipal officials will go to Cleveland on May 15 to accept the certificate.

STEPS TAKEN TO PROTECT HEALTH IN PUTNAM-CO

Ordinance Covering Food And Drink Handlers To Be Effective April 23

(Lima News Bureau) OTTAWA, April 13—Designed to prevent the spread of contagious and venereal diseases, an ordinance has been passed by the Putnam-co board of health requiring all operators and employes of hotels, restaurants, liquor and beer parlors and general food and drinking establishments to obtain sanitary and health certificates each year.

Dr. Harry A. Neiswander of Pandora, county health commissioner, announced this program today and explained that the ordinance will go into effect April 23. After that date any persons coming under the jurisdiction of the ruling will be subject to prosecution unless they comply with it.

The ordinance provides that "any person serving food, drinks or intoxicating liquor in a restaurant, soft drink stand, tourist camp, hotel, beer garden, night club, saloon, tavern, gas station, groceries or meat markets and dairies or any other public places shall procure a certificate from the health commissioner."

Each person applying to the board of health for a health certificate shall be given a complete physical examination including a serology test by a competent physician. The physician shall fill out all the forms prescribed by the health commissioner and if the health commissioner deems it necessary, additional tests must be made before a certificate will be issued.

While each person coming under the jurisdiction of this ordinance is required to voluntarily obtain a certificate of health every 12 months, the commissioner can order special examinations more often if it is provided. Likewise, the establishments will be inspected before the sanitary certificate is issued. The sanitary certificates will cost each proprietor \$2 while the health certificates will cost 50 cents.

Both the owner's certificate and the certificate of each employe must be "conspicuously placed in said establishment so that the same can be readily seen by the public," the ordinance provides.

SECURITY CARD IMPORTANCE IS TOLD WORKERS

A warning to persons who will take defense jobs in the next few months that they must have social security account numbers was issued Saturday by William A. Ashbrook, manager of the Lima field office of the Social Security board. He said: "Persons who work in factories or in business places must have social security account numbers regardless of their age or sex. Many employers now demand that all new workers show their social security cards before they are placed on the pay roll. Applicants for account numbers may be obtained at the Lima field office of the Social Security Board in the Cook Tower, or at any post office. Because of the increased demands for service the hours during which the Lima office is open have now been lengthened. The office is open daily from 9:00 a. m. until 5:00 p. m. and on Saturdays from 9:00 a. m. until 1:00 p. m.
