



The ordinance provides that "any person serving food, drinks offers the traditional Appalachian or intoxicating liquor in a res-Mountain folk tune, "Proggie taurant, soft drink stand, tourist Went a-Courtin'," camp, hotel, beer garden, night camp, hotel, beer garden, night club, saloon, tavern, gas station, groceries or meat markets and dairies or any other public places shall procure a certificate from the health commissioner,"

- Each person applying to the board of health for a health certificate shall be given a complete physical examination including a serology test by a competent physician. The physician shall fill out all the forms prescribed by law for this examination and if the health commissioner deems it necessary, additional tests must be made before a certificate will be issued.

While each person coming unler the jurisdiction of this ordinance is required to voluntarily every 12 months, the commissioner can order special examinations more often, it is provided. Likewise, the establishments
