



Notes for You...

(United Press Drama Editor) NEW YORK-The quality of the theatrical season now in its penultimate month has been so poor that there are rumors along Broadway and its side-streets that the Pulitzer prize committee will take the casy way out by refusing to tap a ploy for honors when it announces its 1942 awards a month from now. No real basis for the rumors, course, but the boys who like to try and guess these things just don't see where a sufficiently meritorious play is

There are a couple of dramas coming in this month which might stand a chance were it not for the fact that the committee which selects the prize play closes its lists by the end of March. Since there is never any publicity given the committee's work, it is possible that it might be waiting for the advent of Philip Barry's "Without Love" and John Steinbeck's "The Moon Is Down," but the chances are against this.

Heliman Play Eligible

However, I would suggest that those looking for a play to receive the Pulitzer acclaim look back a bit farther than the beginning of the present scason last fall, back to Apr. 1, to be exact, when Lillian Hellman's "Watch on the Rhine" opened a highly successful run. The play just recently wound up business here and now is doing excellently on the road. (It will play in Madison on May 5.)

The drama about the fight against Nazism, the best of its type to date, would appear to have all of the qualities demanded of a Pulitzer play and the time element is not against it, if you will consider the facts. It would still be eligible because its Apr. 1 premiere last year came too late for it to be considered for the 1941 prize. And remember that the 1941 winner, Robert E. Sherwood's "There Shall Be No wood's Night," Night," another pro-demo-cratic document, made its debut here Apr. 29, 1940. When the Pulitzer prize committee came up with that one last spring there. spring there was an aston-ished person for every light on Broadway.

Incidentally, if "Watch on the Rhine" should get the Pul-itzer nod this year it would have the unique distinction of winning the two top drama prizes in different years. The Drama Critics Circle's 1941 award went to this play he-cause, although the Circle anpounces its winner a few days before the Pulitzer committee, it considers anything pro-duced up to the time the members start voting.
