

"To The Shores Of Tripoli" Opens Wednesday At Quilna

John Payne, Maureen O'Hara And Randolph Scott Have Leads; Stanwyck And Cooper Teamed In Ohio Attraction

The Quilna theatre breaks out with a timely burst of rapid-fire entertainment in a cinema barrage, "To the Shores of Tripoli" that opens in preview Wednesday evening. Again the omni-present United States Marine Corps takes a bow with "the situation well in hand." John Payne, Maureen O'Hara and Randolph Scott have the leads. Until preview time at the Quilna, "Confessions of Boston Blackie" and "Blondie Goes to College" occupy the silver sheet.

How a gal all broken out with glamor and kindred accessories mixes it up with metaphors and such with eight college professors, is the theme of "Ball of Fire," at the Ohio theatre. Barbara Stanwyck quivers thru the title role with Gary (Dictionary Deeds) Cooper as an action factor.
