

Latest Andy Hardy Picture Opens At The Ohio Saturday

Mickey Rooney Again Cast In Title Role Of Film Depicting The Life And Loves Of An Up And Coming Young Man

Andy Hardy finds a new romance and successfully gets out of it to become a free man again in "The Courtship of Andy Hardy," latest picture of the popular family series, which commences Saturday at the Ohio theatre. Donna Reed is the glittering new cinema pulse pounder of Mickey Rooney. Other standbys of the series include Lewis Stone, Cecilia Parker, Fay Holden, Ann Rutherford. Showing for the last times Friday is "Ball of Fire," starring Gary Cooper and Barbara Stanwyck.

"To the Shores of Tripoli," the current Quilna attraction, is a film about and dedicated to the toughest fighting men in the world—the U. S. Marines. Stars of the film are John Payne, Maureen O'Hara and Randolph Scott and a hand-picked cast of featured players including Nancy Kelly, William Tracy, Maxie Rosenbloom and Henry Morgan.

The love story of Hoppity, grasshopper hero, and Honey Bee, the heroine, is contained in the new Sigma cartoon comedy commencing Saturday, "Mr. Bug Goes to Town." Co-featured is "Dangerously They Live," starring John Garfield, Nancy Coleman and Raymond Massey. Showing for the last times Friday are "Nazi Agent" and "Mexican Spitfire at Sea."

The new Humphrey Bogart picture, "All Thru the Night," is creating the excitement of the State theatre. It's a story of a bunch of ex-gangsters who battle the Gestapo, offering something new in the way of screen entertainment. Co-featured is "Steel Against the Sky," starring Alexis Smith, Lloyd Nolan and Craig Stevens.

Tyrone Power and Betty Grable have the starring roles of the current Lyric film, "A Yank in the R. A. F.," story of an American hero in a foreign fighting outfit and his romance with a beautiful chorus girl. Co-featured is "Blonde Comet," starring Robert Kent, Virginia Vale and Barney Oldfield. Majestic films for Saturday are "Springtime in the Rockies," starring Gene Autry, and "Ice-Capades."

"The Courtship of Andy Hardy" opens Saturday at the Ohio theatre and will prove a tip-top addition to the popular family series. Every father, mother and child enjoyed the antics of Carvel's Number One boy and America's Number One actor, Mickey Rooney was never better than in the new Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer picture. And Donna Reed, as the latest romance in Andy's life, proves a charmer destined for top stardom in Hollywood.

Lewis Stone again is the wise small-town judge, and his "maito-man" talks with Mickey as a highlight. Fay Holden, Cecilia Parker, in her most dramatic role of the series, Ann Rutherford and Sara Haden all register in their familiar characterizations. The story concerns Judge Hardy's attempt to smooth out the ruffled life of Melodie Nesbit (Miss Reed), whose separated parents bring their squabbles to his court. In his pity for the girl, he enlists the aid of Andy, who hesitantly consents to take her to her first dance.

She proves the wall flower he had expected, but at a second dance blossoms out as a beautiful and charming debutante. But, despite her crush on Andy, he doesn't return her feelings, something he himself can't understand. He does manage to swing her affections to another boy, John Alden, style, however, and then escapes the clutches of Polly Benedict who returns seeking his attentions.

William Lundigan and Steve Cornell join Miss Reed as two more newcomers to the series, both of whom look like leading man prospects. Harvey Stephens and Frieda Inescort are effective as the battling parents of Miss Reed.

At least one Marine in the U. S. Marine Corps looks exactly like John Payne—in the back of the neck. And because he does, he earned \$75—just to get a haircut he would have had to undergo anyway.

Honey he is ready to sacrifice all of Bugville. But with a skip, hop and jump, Hoppity goes to the rescue, sounds the call to wings, and Bugville takes off on one of the most enchanting flights of fancy that has ever been drawn for the screen.

DENTAL COURSE WILL BE CUT TO THREE YEARS

COLUMBUS, O., April 17—(AP)—Ohio State university's four-year dental course will be accelerated to three years starting June 22 to provide more graduates for Army and civilian practice.

Dean Wendell D. Postle of the Dentistry college said three-year graduates will receive the same instruction as previous four-year students thru a program of year-round classes. He addressed an assembly of mid-western dentists on the campus yesterday.

Col. Howard E. Boucher of the Ohio Selective Service system's medical section said that although there now was "no essential shortage" of dentists in the Army, thousands would be needed before year-end.

He urged Ohio dentists to apply for Army commissions at Fifth Corps area headquarters here and cautioned that the professional men would be drafted as privates if volunteers were insufficient. He intimated that most dentists under 37 could expect to see military service this year or early in 1943.

Those up to 45 may be called on later, he added.

State dental board directors showed 215 of Ohio's 4,300 dentists now in military service but a spokesman intimated that the file probably was incomplete and the total on active duty much larger.
