ENOUGH TO BID HIGHER. THERE ARE times when your hand does not justify your entering the bidding with an overall at the range of one, but is good enough to bid two at a later stage. If your partner had done nothing but pass when your chance to bid one arrived, and the last call had been made by the opponent at your right, the bidding still is open. It is then possible that the opponent at your left has all of the remaining strength and your partner is blank. But, if a suit bid by the man at the left is then passed by the one at your right, you know the opponents are not extra strong, and that therefore your partner has something.

Congressmen Are People, Their Official Doctor Learns

WASHINGTON — (U.P.) — Congressmen are people. At any rate, they react just like other citizens to wartime stresses and strains. That means there has been a normal increase since Pearl Harbor in the number of congressmen suffering from fatigue, nervous exhaustion, or gastro-intestinal complaints induced by emotional high pressure. But don't think congress is "shot." The opposite is true, according to Dr. George W. Calver, physician in attendance upon senators and representatives.

Dr. Calver should know. By congressional standards of service, he is a veteran in the capitol. Ever since congress began holding at least continuous sessions three and a half years ago, however, the doctor has noted an increase in the number of congressional maladies which may be blamed upon unremitting labor and worry. Gastric ulcer and certain types of heart disturbance caused or complicated by nervous tension have increased in that period. Oddly enough, however, certain individuals in congress are in better fettle than they were before Pearl Harbor. The explanation is less wrangling and more unity of purpose.

Dr. Calver washes neither politeness nor convention speech upon congressmen who willfully fail to follow his health precepts. "Calver," a senator once said, "does out a combination of coaxing and cussing, and between the two you learn to behave yourself." As a navy doctor—he holds the rank of captain—Calver mastered the art of forceful expression before he ever treated a congressman. For senators or representatives

U. S. to Enlist State Mechanics

MILWAUKEE — (U.P.) — Ordnance officers today accepted enlistments of expert mechanics in an effort to fill Wisconsin's quota of 300 requested by the war department. The mechanics will be put into ordnance regiments to accompany mechanized units of the army and keep their equipment in good condition. A total of 8,000 from the entire nation will be enlisted before May 1. Col. D. C. Cabell, who came here from Washington to speed enlistment, explained. Machinists and machine operators, engine or automobile mechanics, electricians, draftsmen, welders and other specialists between the ages of 18 and 45 are being accepted, Cabell said.

Leonard J. Wyeth, of the Union club in New York, sitting in the South position, gave a very splendid example on this deal of the advisability of making a bid based on deductions that his partner had a certain amount of strength. But after West bid 2-Clubs and East passed this, he knew the other side could not be very strong. Hence he knew his partner had a fair amount of strength, so he then bid 2-Spades without trepidation. Sure enough, his partner had some strength and raised to 3-Spades, being sure the suit was a five-carder, and Mr. Wyeth took it to 4-Spades. The reward was a nice game, as only two tricks were lost in clubs and one in diamonds, since the trump finesse worked.
