The Gust herd averaged 1,260 pounds of milk, 3.48 test, and 43.7 fat. Figures for the Curtis Baker herd were 1,200, 3.29, and 38.9, and for the Fred Wittwer herd 1,035, 3.23, and 33.4. The Bratrud high cow milked 1,883 pounds, 4.5 test, and 73.7 fat. Other high cows were Curtis Baker, 2,068, 3.4 and 70.9; C. O. Field, 1,953, 3.3, and 64.4; and Curtis Baker, 1,786, 3.6, and 64.3.

War Makes Bug Powders Scarcer Now

CHICAGO—(U.P.)—The makers of bug powder predicted today that insects will wage a troublesome spring and summer offensive this year because the chemicals for insect poisons are being used in munitions. A survey of Chicago insecticide manufacturers revealed: 1. Chemicals most effective in many insecticides against bugs have been called into service on other fronts. 2. Bug powder prices are up more than 30 per cent and the available supply, already reduced below normal, is being rationed. And finally, even the lowly fly swatter will be at a premium because its usual materials, rubber or metal, are being used to "slap the Japs."

Manufacturers hold that development of new weapons, including plentiful chemicals, to fight insects will take time. Most efficient substitutes thus far have the disadvantage of being expensive. Farmers, who must protect much-needed crops, are at the head of the priorities list for insecticides. Hospitals are next, and then house-wives who face an estimated 7,000 species of insects in all parts of the nation.
