Bullet-in-Heart Sailors Want More Fighting

SAN FRANCISCO - (U.P.) Two American sailors, from whose hearts skilled surgeons removed pieces of enemy bullets fired at Pearl Harbor, want "to get back at those Japs."

One, First Class Seaman James 3. Barker, McLeansborough, Ill., already is back at sea, and the other, Fire Controlman Third Class Dean G. Derrow, Wauwatosa, Wis., said, "I'm ready to get back at those Japs as soon as I can get out

of this bed.' Neither knew of his heart wound until he noticed shortness of breath several days after the Pearl Harbor attack. In both cases, navy surgeons performed delicate oper ations and successfully removed

the fragments. Barker was struck by shrapnel during the Japanese attack on his ship and was treated for wounds of the leg and shoulder. He returned to duty and then complained of shortness of breath. Doctors found a piece of shrapnel three-quarters by one-half inch in size embedded

in his heart.

Darrow, still in a west coast naval hospital where the operations were performed, was struck by a bullet during an attack on his ship. The impact knocked him down but he continued fighting and forgot about the wound. Within a few days he noticed he became winded easily after heavy exertion.

Doctors found particles of a bullet, about the size of a .30 caliber slug, imbedded in a heart muscle.
