

Physical Overhaul Planned For Barrymore On Thursday

Actor Reginald Gardiner Will Attempt Feat During Vallejo Program; Town Meeting Set In Fort Wayne

Apparently no one ever thought about it seriously before, but screen actor, Reginald Gardiner will attempt a physical overhaul of John Barrymore on the Rudy Vallejo program, Thursday at 10 p. m. over WEAF.

James Lawrence Fly, chairman of the Federal Communications Commission, will act as moderator of "America's Town Meeting of the Air," to be broadcast from Fort Wayne, from 9 to 10 p. m., over WJZ. With George V. Denny, Jr., president of Town Hall, and permanent moderator for "Town Meeting," stepping into the role of speaker for the first time in the series, a cross-section of thinking American's reaction to the evening's topic: "The Role of Criticism in Wartime," will be presented to the radio audience.

SUGAR RATIONING MATERIAL IS ISSUED

75,000 SUGAR USERS IN COUNTY WILL REGISTER; SUPPLIES DISTRIBUTED

Machinery was placed in motion Thursday for the registration of approximately 75,000 Lima and Allen-co sugar consumers beginning next Monday and running thru Thursday.

Registration will be conducted at all city and county public elementary schools under the supervision of school teachers. County Rationing Coordinator Harry Fox announced that distribution of supplies for the four-day registration days was in progress Thursday.

On Monday, all consumers including those with names from "A" thru "E" must register if they hope to make future sugar purchases. Tuesday's registrants will be from "F" thru "K," Wednesday, from "L" thru "R," and Thursday from "S" thru "Z."

Registrants will have the privilege of registering at the closest public elementary school. Registration will not be conducted at parochial schools.

Every individual in the family must register. Any member of the family may register for the whole family group, Coordinator Fox explained. Individual rationing cards will be issued to parents and each of their children.

From the stage wings the paratrooper's voice related that the soldier really wasn't much fretted by K. P. duty — he was a lot more concerned about keeping guns and tanks rolling off the production line.

From that opening scene until the flags of the 26 United Nations are massed in the finale, "All Out For Victory" waves the flag and plugs production on the home front.

It is an original musical revue produced by workers in the War department's Cleveland ordnance district office — an unpaid, spare-time activity for the good of the cause. Ordnance officers dug into their pockets to pay for the costumes.

Given its premiere before an applauding crowd of 500 officers and employes and industrialists last night, the show soon will visit northern Ohio war plants to stir pride and patriotism in the men behind the scenes behind the scenes.

In eight scenes, the show tells the audience to write to the boys in camp; to keep audience rolling; gives a glimpse of the soldiers in the foxholes of Ibatan, and lampoons mildly the government's "simplified short forms."
