WASHINGTON - (U.P.) - The gricultural department announced today that it will make loans averaging \$1.14 a bushel on 1942 wheat to growers who comply with the Agricultural Adjustment Administration program.

The loan rate is 16 cents a bu-

shel higher than the 1941 national average. The department also announced Ioan rates on rye, bar-ley, and grain sorghum at approximately 1941 levels. The wheat loan program is con-

tingent upon the approval of twothirds of the growers voting on a market quota referendum to be held Saturday. The loan rates will be approximately 85 per cent of

PSC to Probe **Bus Service in** Maple Bluff

A public hearing on formal com-plaint of the village of Maple Bluff against service of the Maple Bluff-Mendota Bus Lines, Inc., will be held at 10 a, m. May 22 in the state office building, the state public service commission announced to-

day.

The village filed a complaint with the commission on Apr. 23 as result of a resolution adopted by its board of trustees on Apr. 9.

"There have been numerous complaints on the part of residents of Maple Bluff to the effect that the transportation service offered by the Mendota Bus Co. is becomng more and more irregular and insatisfactory," the trustees' resolution read.

The resolution said there have been complaints that the bus operated by the company is not maintained and kept up to a reasonable tandard.

As result of the trustees' action the commission announced it would investigate the complaint and hold a public hearing.


