

Nelson Eddy Chooses Great List Of Hits For Program

Golden-Voiced Baritone To Be Heard At 8 P. M. Wednesday; Shirley Temple Set On Regular Junior Miss Show

Nelson Eddy, golden-voiced baritone has chosen an unusually varied and interesting program of songs for the broadcast at 8 p. m. Wednesday over WABC.

Accompanied by Robert Armbruster's orchestra, Eddy will sing "The Rangers Song" from Rio Rita, "Thy Beaming Eyes" by MacDowell, "The Canadian Logging Song" by Keith Crosby Brown, "Anchors Aweigh," "Joshua Fit the Battle of Jericho" and "The Hills of Home." In certain of the songs, Eddy will be joined by the Old Gold chorus of eight men and four women.

Out of cash and going all-out for Mother's Day, Shirley Temple, as Judy Graves, will introduce new temptations into the family until even Hilda, the maid, is almost lead astray in the "Junior Miss" broadcast over WABC at 9 p. m.

When Judy discovers that her personal funds are insufficient for a suitable Mother's Day gift, she embarks on a cash-raising campaign that puts both Mr. Graves and Hilda out for the count of 10, and ends up in a financial impasse of major proportions.

Nazi spies enter the picture on the "Mr. District Attorney" broadcast at 9:30 p. m. on the WEAF network, when the "D.A." solves "The Case of the Whispered Word." Centering around the efforts of enemy agents to extract important military secrets from crew members of merchant ships, this story emphasizes the vital importance of silence on even seemingly trivial aspects of the nation's war effort. Originally, "The Case of the Whispered Word" was scheduled for broadcast a few weeks ago, but production was withheld at that time to permit consideration of a policy regarding programs of this type. Jay Jostyn is heard in the title role, with Miss Miller, his secretary, played by Vicki Vola, and Len Doyle in the part of Harrington, chief special investigator. Scripts for the series are written by Ed Byron and Jerry McGill, and production is handled by Ed Byron. Peter Van Steeden is music director.

Two of the closest associates of the late Florenz Ziegfeld—his widow and his most famous comic—will review the saga of Broadway's most famous showman when Billie Burke is guest of the "Time To Smile" program from Hollywood at 9 p. m. over WEAF.

Dinar Shore and Harry von Zell are set for a musically nostalgic evening. Even Bert "The Mad Russian" Gordon is ready to polish off a few memories of a Broadway which remembers him as "Desperate Sam" in his cowboy travesty at the Palace.

Miss Burke and her host will turn time back to the Ziegfeld "Follies of 1917" when a slight, mining figure in black-face named Cantor made his Broadway debut in a skit entitled "The Episode of the Information Bureau." A cavalcade of songs popularized by Cantor from earliest Ziegfeld days

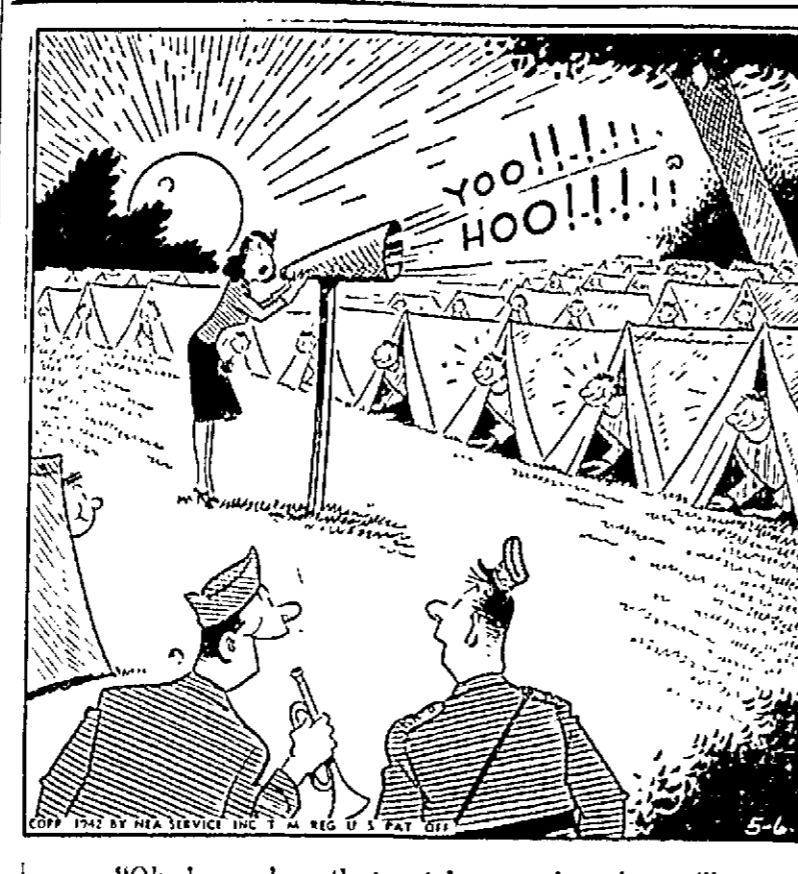

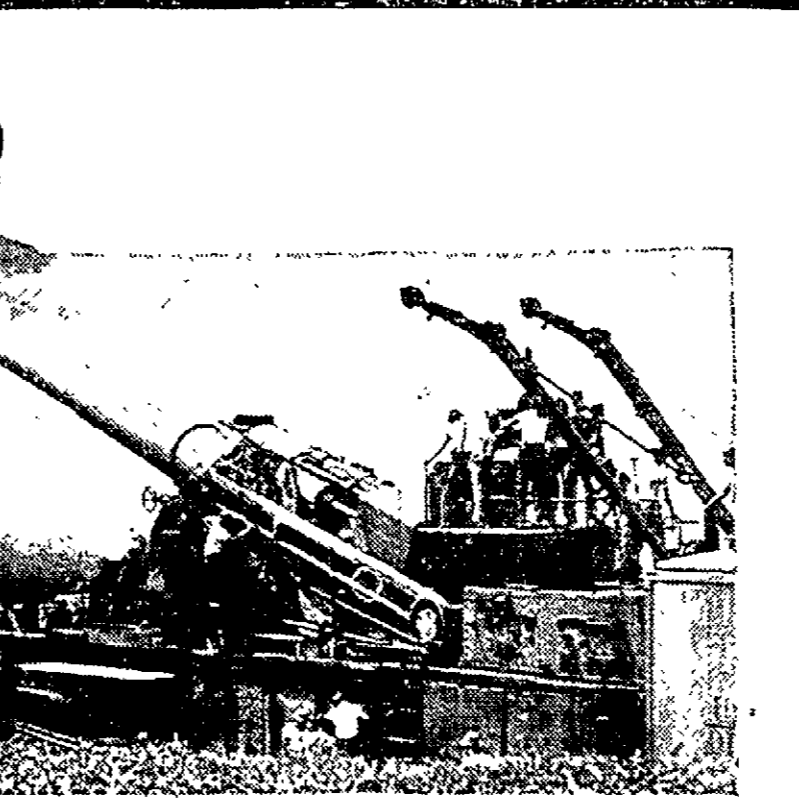

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING BLACKOUT AND AIR RAID PROTECTION ORDERS, REGULATIONS, PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, a state of war exists between the United States of America and Japan, Germany and Italy, and the defense of the United States of America is in the hands of the Army and Navy; and

WHEREAS, in modern warfare the home front is as important as the front lines; and

WHEREAS, lights at night time are a menace to the safety of the country in reaching military and other objectives; and

WHEREAS, Blackouts, when ordered, are of great importance to the preservation of life and property in this city, and it is imperative that the City of Lima and the Army and Navy by all possible cooperation and assistance;

WHEREAS, failure to extinguish lights when ordered to do so by the proper authorities in this city will result in loss of life by thousands of residents of the City of Lima as well as the lives of other parts of the nation when lights in this city are used as a guide to military objectives; and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with orders, rules and regulations promulgated by the Mayor, Board of Health and the Board of Public Safety, and other persons in streets and other public places will result in confusion and unnecessary loss of life and property during air raids in the daytime; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the municipal government that in order to protect the public health, property and safety it is immediately necessary that the Mayor be authorized to promulgate rules and regulations as may be necessary to insure success of blackout and air raid protection measures; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LIMA, OHIO, TWO-THIRDS OF THE MEMBERS ELECTED THEREOF:

Section 1. Authority to promulgate necessary orders, rules and regulations for the protection of life and property in this city from enemy action the Mayor be authorized to promulgate, and such orders, rules and regulations as may be necessary to insure success of blackout and air raid protection measures in said city at such times and at such periods as are authorized or ordered by the Army or Navy and to promulgate such orders, rules and regulations as may be necessary to insure the success of the blackout and air raid protection measures and to protect life and property during said periods. Said orders, rules and regulations shall include: traffic movements of emergency or other vehicles, evacuation of residents, congregation of persons in public places, sidewalks, and in public places or buildings; but this enumeration shall not be taken as a limitation on the power to promulgate orders, rules, regulations governing any other subject necessary to protect life and property in this city which must be regulated in order to insure the proper carrying out of any duly authorized blackout or air raid protection measure. Practice blackouts and air raid drills may be carried out at such times and for such periods as the Mayor shall in his discretion deem appropriate and necessary, but always to the orders and direction of the Army or Navy, and the orders, rules and regulations authorized herein.

Section 2. GENERAL ORDERS, RULES AND REGULATIONS TO BE IN EFFECT DURING ALL ORDERS, RULES AND REGULATIONS AUTHORIZED BY THIS ORDINANCE FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE general public shall be in writing and shall be available for public inspection at the place and during the hours set by the Mayor.

Section 3. ORDERS, RULES AND REGULATIONS, EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY UPON THE COMMENCEMENT OF ANY ORDER, RULE OR REGULATION promulgated pursuant to the authority conferred by this ordinance shall be in force and effect from the time of promulgation until amended or repealed by the Council of the City of Lima, Ohio.

Section 4. APPOINTMENT OF SPECIAL POLICE—IDENTIFYING EMBLEM. The Mayor may appoint for the specified time as municipal special police, without pay, from among the residents of the City of Lima as may be deemed advisable for service in connection with any blackout or air raid protection measure. During the term of service of such special police, they shall possess all the powers and privileges and perform all the duties of police in the city and police force of the City of Lima. Said special police must wear such identifying emblem as may be prescribed by the Mayor and it shall be unlawful for any said special policeman to attempt to carry out any order, rule or regulation promulgated under the authority conferred by this ordinance when he is not wearing said identifying emblem.

Section 5. UNAUTHORIZED WARNINGS OR ALLEGED SIGNS PROHIBITED. Any unauthorized person who shall operate a siren or other device or sign to simulate a blackout signal or air raid, or the extinguishing of a blackout or air raid, shall be deemed guilty of a violation of this ordinance and shall be subject to the penalties hereof in connection with this Ordinance.

Section 6. NO MUNICIPAL OR PRIVATE LIGHTS. During the term of any order, rule or regulation promulgated pursuant to the provisions of this ordinance, no municipal, private, or other light shall be used in this city, or any other place, to simulate a blackout signal or air raid, or the extinguishing of a blackout or air raid, or to otherwise interfere with the carrying out of any order, rule or regulation promulgated pursuant to the authority conferred by this ordinance.

Section 8. CONFLICTING ORDINANCES, ORDERS, RULES AND REGULATIONS. In the event of any conflict between any order, rule or regulation made and promulgated pursuant to the provisions of this ordinance and any other order, rule or regulation which shall be in effect, they shall
