Young Actor, Now Sergeant In U. S. Army, Will Be Interviewed And Confused By Col. Stoopnagle At 7 P. M.

Ezra Stone, one of radio's brightest young stars, will be a guest on the Ontario show, to cement good-will between the sister nations, on Friday at 7 p. m. over WJZ.

Stone, a sergeant in the United States Army, will be interviewed and confused by Col. Lemuel Q. Stoopnagle, whose broadcasts from Canada have made him somewhat of an international favorite.

Margaret Webster, distinguished actress, director and producer of Shakespearean works, and Richard Maney, distinguished publicist of anything on Broadway that the Bard did NOT write, will square off in the medullary ring of "Information Please" Friday at 8:30 p. m. over WJZ.

As always, in the other two corners are the regular brain-bruizers, Franklin P. Adams and John Kieran, with Clifton Fadiman as referee.

Music from popular shows of recent vintage will featured billing Friday at 8 p. m. on WJZ. The ensemble offers "All the Things You Are" from Jerome Kern's "Very Warm for May" and "Where Do You Travel" from the current Broadway success, "Best Foot Forward," while Lucille Manners sings "Smoke Gets in Your Eyes" from Kern's "Roberta."

Frank Munn introduces a new American song on "Waltz Time" Friday, the title is "Prairie Lullaby" and the composers are Aldrich and Borodkin. (WJZ 9 p. m.)

The tenor also is to be heard in "How Do I Know It's Real?" "Full Moon" and "Sing Me a Song of the Islands." TIRE QUOTAS IN PUTNAM-CO FOR MAY REDUCED

(Lima News Bureau) OTTAWA, May 8.—Revision of the tire quotas for Putnam-co in May was announced here today by Rating Coordinator Edward J. Tendorf.

There will be 13 passenger tires available instead of 23 as in April while only 38 new passenger car tubes will be rationed. There will be 64 recapped tires available for rationing this month in the county.

A decrease also is noted in the quota of truck tires which is 55 as compared with 93 for April. Truck tubes totaling 111 will be available for rationing with 81 recapped truck tires.

BUSINESS SLOW IN COURT HERE

Business was slow in the Allen-co common pleas court Thursday. One divorce was granted, a church was allowed to execute a mortgage and two cases were dismissed.

The First Church of God was granted permission to execute a \$15,000 note and mortgage to the Board of Church Extension and Home Missions of the Church of God, Anderson, Ind.

On a plea of gross neglect of duty, Julia Myers was granted a divorce from Clyde M. Myers. The plaintiff was awarded custody of one minor child and defendant was directed to pay \$8 a week for its support.

Dismissed without prejudice and without record was the case of Georgina Cox against Rondell Cox. The action was dismissed by the plaintiff at her costs.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS EXPLAIN RENT FREEZING

WASHINGTON, May 8.—(AP)—Price Administrator Leon Henderson has ordered rents reduced and stabilized in 302 defense areas within 60 days. In 259 of the areas, the rent prevailing on March 1, 1942 was fixed as the maximum that may be charged; in 28 areas the maximum date set was April 1, 1941; in eight areas the date chosen was Jan. 1, 1941, and in the remaining seven the date was July 1, 1941.

The following questions and answers, prepared by the office of price administration explain the procedure, based on the March 1, 1941 date. In the other areas the proper date should be substituted:

Q. I live in one of the defense-rental areas designated by Mr. Henderson and my rent has been increased since March 1, 1942. The maximum rent date which Mr. Henderson has just recommended for my area. How soon may I expect a cut in rent?

A. Under the emergency control act the federal government cannot order rents reduced for 60 days. During this waiting period, any reduction is up to your landlord or to state and local action.

Q. What will happen at the end of 60 days?

A. If, at the end of 60 days, Mr. Henderson finds that his recommendations for the area have not been met, he can step in at any time and regulate rents. Q. By what method will Mr. Henderson establish maximum rents?

A. He will order all housing rents held to the rents in effect on a specified date. That date is the "maximum-rent date." As a general principle the rent for any house can be no more than the rent for that house on the maximum-rent date. Special regulations will control rents in houses that were not rented on the maximum-rent date.

Q. My rent was raised from \$22 to \$40 a month on April 1, 1942. Suppose that Mr. Henderson, after the 60-day waiting period, orders rents held at the March 1, 1942 level. Will I receive a refund?

A. No, you will receive no refund. But after the 60-day period and after the price administrator has issued regulations for your area, you will pay only \$22.

Q. But I signed a new lease at \$40 a month, and the lease has 11 months to run. Must I still pay \$40?

A. No, you will pay no more than \$22 regardless of any lease, sub-lease, agreement, contract or other obligation.

Q. If rents are pegged, how will the landlord meet any increase in his costs?

A. The law requires the administrator to "make adjustments for such relevant factors as he may determine and deem to be of general applicability, including increases or decreases in property taxes and other costs."

Q. What happens to the landlord if he has made extensive and major alterations in the house since the maximum-rent date?

A. Regulations will permit an adjustment in rents in exceptional cases and where there has been no attempt to evade the law.

Q. After the administrator has established maximum rents in a particular area, what control is there over services?

A. Mr. Henderson has authority to regulate "all privileges, services, furnishings, furniture and facilities connected with the use or occupancy" of rented living quarters. Effective rent control requires control of services as well as control of rent.

Q. What sort of housing accommodations does the rent-control law cover?

A. Everything from a house to a trailer — including flats, apartments, tenements, single houses, duplex houses, boarding and rooming houses, hotel rooms, and tourist camps.

Q. Does the rent control law apply to federal housing projects?

A. Yes, to all housing accommodations in a defense-rental area, whether owned or operated by individuals, corporations, or the government.

Q. Are stores and commercial buildings included?

A. No, the rent control law applies only to dwelling accommodations.

Q. Just what is a "defense-rental area"?

A. The administrator may declare any part of the county a "defense-rental area," whenever, in his judgment, "defense activities have resulted or threatened to result in an increase in rents for housing accommodations inconsistent with the purpose of this (emergency price control) act."

Q. What is the status of a fair rent committee after an area has been declared a "defense-rental area"?

A. Fair rent committees are local organizations but may continue to play an important part in helping local officials prevent evictions and reduce and stabilize rents.

Q. Are there teeth in the law?

A. Yes, violations of administrative orders may be punished by maximum fines of \$5,000 or one year's imprisonment, or both.

Q. Are there remedies against a landlord who demands or receives rents in excess of the established maximum?

A. Yes. In addition to the criminal penalties, the administrator

may obtain a court order to prohibit an excessive charge, and, after August 1, 1942, the administrator of the tenant may sue for \$50 or triple the amount by which the rent exceeded the maximum, whichever amount is larger.

Q. Does the act provide the tenant against eviction?

A. Yes. It is unlawful for any person to remove a tenant or refuse to renew a lease because the tenant has taken or proposes to take action under the rent-control regulations.

Q. What power does the government have to check up on rents and service?

A. The price administrator has the right to inspect any housing accommodation to require anyone who rents or offers housing accommodations for rent to keep records which shall be open to the inspection of the administrator, to make efforts, and to furnish information under oath.

Q. Is rent control something new?

A. No. In the last war a number of states set up rent control of various kinds, but the last war did not produce the acute dislocation in housing that we have already seen in this war. England has had limited national control over rents ever since the last war, and sharp control since the outbreak of the present war.

DEDICATION OF FLAG POLE IS SET AT OTTAWA

A flag will be raised on the pole for the first time. The board of county commissioner has purchased a pole, a flag and the necessary equipment for the pole while County Engineer John Maudlow, Sr., has placed a concrete base for the pole in the lawn.

There will be a parade led by a band, an address and other ceremonies May 17. Citizens from all parts of Putnam-co are being urged to attend this patriotic event.

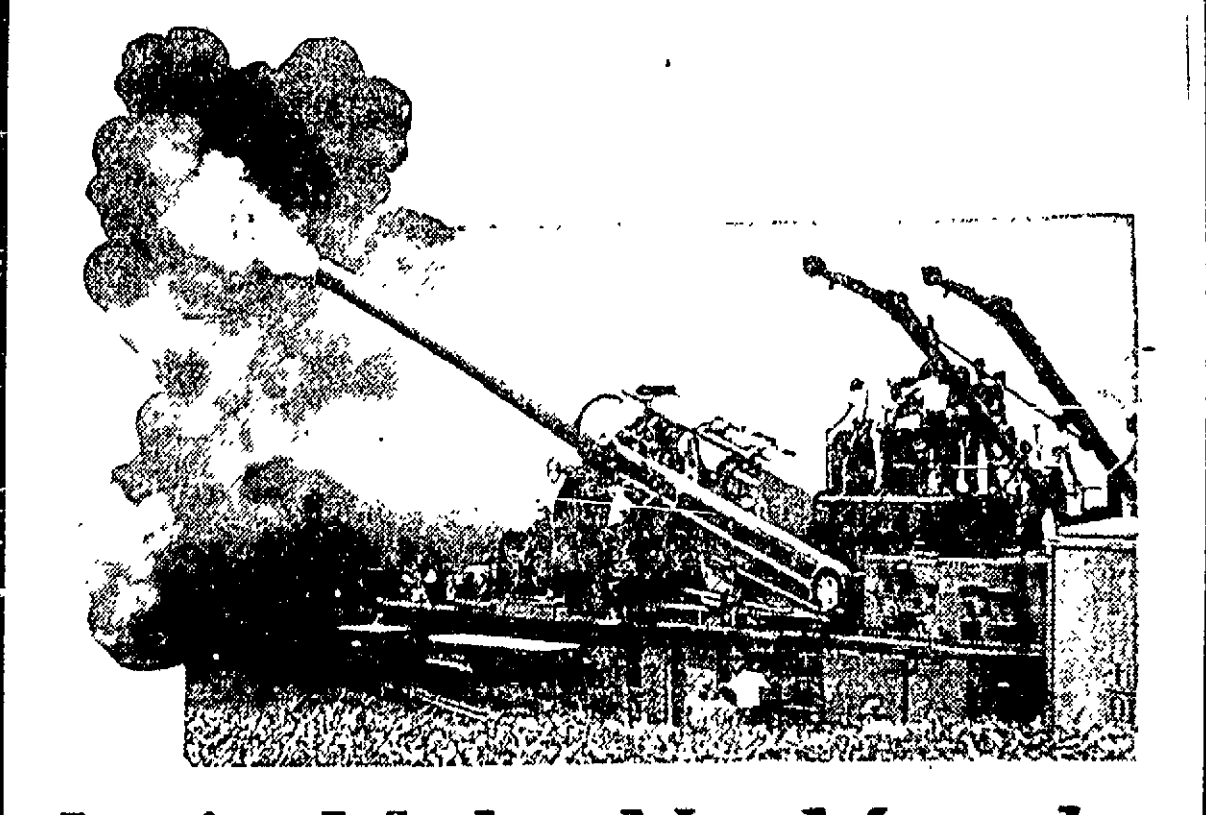
