



Officials Admit They Have Expected Curtailment For Some Time

COLUMBUS, O., May 15-(AP)—Those rationing coupons issued for sugar purchases might be needed one of these days to keep gasoline in the family automobile, Ohio officials asserted to-

"We've been expecting gasoline rationing for some time but haven't had any definite word," one rationing official declared. He added that only the first four stamps in war ration book No. 1 had been designated for sugar purchases and that others could be used for easoline.

Gasoline consumption would be limited in Ohio to conserve tires and decrease highway wear rather than because of any shortage, a spokesman for state rationing headquarters declared.

Rep. James E. Van Zandt (R.-Pa.), predicted yesterday that gasoline rationing would begin in castern Ohio and western Pennsylvania in two weeks. Congressmen reported in Washington, meanwhile, there were strong indications that nationwide motor fuel rationing might be instituted by July 1.

Tire and motor vehicle rationing reduced Ohio highway traffic 17.44 per cent last month as compared with April, 1941, Highway Director Hal G. Sours reported. Motor fuel taxed in the first three months of this year totaled 322,119,394 gallons, an increase of 1,191,687 over the same period


