Top Brands of Cheese Hold Steady

MONROE — Prices being offered Swiss cheese producers of this area for March make of Swiss vary considerably on the three lower grades with the two top grades, state brand A and state brand, being fairly well established at previous levels of 20 and 28 cents per pound, respectively.

Producers through their bargaining committee had asked a half cent higher for each grade. Some Swiss cheese is reported actually moving with other being held in dealers' storage until price agreements can be affected.

Wisconsin C. Wisconsin No. 3 and grinders are being quoted at price ranges varying as much as 1 1/4 cents in some instances. Offers on the three lower grades in all cases known are lower than prices generally paid for February cheese.

One dealer offers a 29, 28, 25 1/2, 21 1/2 and 20 1/2 cent a pound scale; another 29, 28, 25, 22 1/2 and 20, and still another, 28, 27, 25, 23, and 20. These prices represent re-

ductions from those of February of from one to 2 1/2 cents a pound. The Monroe brick cheese quotation for next week remains still at 18 1/2 cents per pound.
