# State Spends Two Million to Treat TB

Wisconsin's progress toward the conquest of tuberculosis is being made at the per capita cost of 66 cents annually for sanatorium care, making the state's ninth leading death cause its most expensive one, according to the state board of health.

Dr. E. H. Jorris, the board's tuberculosis control officer, cited today that expenditures for such care reached a state total of more than \$2,000,000 for the year end-ing last June 30. Only 4 per cent of this cost was borne by patients. The state paid 39 per cent of the total, and the balance of 57 per cent was borne by counties. State records show an average

of 2,093 tuberculosis patients under sanatorium treatment for the period. There were in addition 1,295 known active caases not receiving sanatorium care, of which 385 had positive sputum records. Reporting of active cases has trebled since Jan. 1, 1942, Dr. Jorris pointed out, through selective service examinations, use of the state's midget x-ray unit, and improved reporting methods.




