LOCO WILL ADD STORY TO NEW OFFICE ANNEX

Increased activity at the Lima Locomotive Works has necessitated an extra story being added to the new brick addition to the loco's big office building.

The annex, originally scheduled as a \$60,000 four-story structure, will go one story higher at an additional cost of \$15,000.

Permit for the extra story was issued Saturday by City Engineer Frank Cappy.

The permit boosted the year's building total past the \$550,000 mark. The exact figure for the year's new construction and remodeling business is \$568,833. The month of May thus far has contributed \$45,783 to the 1942 total.

Another sizeable permit issued the past week was one for a \$5,000 storage room for the Sioux Honey-assn., 435 N. Elizabeth-st. The structure, to be built of concrete block, will be 100 by 40 feet.

The permit permits one for a new home and the others for residential remodeling projects, were issued during the week.

DOUBLE RITES ARRANGED FOR CRASH VICTIMS

WAPAKONETA, May 23 — Double funeral services were held at 2 p. m. Saturday in the Heald Bros. and Son funeral home for Mr. and Mrs. Fred Schaub, who died from injuries suffered when the auto in which they were riding collided with another operated by Ira Baber, of Near St. Johns, nine miles east of here late Tuesday afternoon.

Mrs. Schaub was killed instantly and her husband died early Thursday evening in Lima Memorial hospital. The condition of Baber, who is confined to Lima Memorial hospital, remains serious.

Mr. and Mrs. Schaub are survived by a son, Robert, of this city, and a daughter, Mrs. Herman Haynes, of Richmondale. Also surviving Schaub are two brothers, Otto and Henry, both of this city, and a sister, Mrs. Louise McKinney, of Cleveland.

APPEALS COURT WILL BE BUSY

With a number of cases filed from four different counties, members of the Third District Court of Appeals will be busy on next Monday and Tuesday.

In the Allen-co case of Stato v. Ohio ex rel. Edward A. and Frances Schaefer, against the Judge of the Court of Common Pleas of Allen-co, Ohio, a hearing will be conducted Tuesday. The suit is an application for a writ of mandamus to require the common pleas court to rule on a motion.

From Van Wert-co come two cases, each of which will be heard Monday. Elzora Jones against Idis Jones is a divorce and alimony suit. Vivian A. Walters against Doyt A. Walters is a similar case.

The defendant in the case which comes from Logan-co, is charged with felonious assault on a 14-year-old girl. Also from the same county is the suit of C. E. Zimmerman against C. E. Duff which will be heard Tuesday.

MAN WHO KILLED MOTHER SENT TO LIMA HOSPITAL

WOOSTER, May 23 — (INS) — Judge Walter J. Moughey today ordered Arch R. Matteson, 33, of Orrville, sent to Lima State hospital for a 30-day examination when Matteson pleaded not guilty to a charge of murdering his mother, Mrs. Ina Florence Matteson, on May 7.

According to Wayne-co authorities, Matteson admitted beating his mother to death "because a supreme command ordered me to do so."

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
