

# Rita Hayworth Heartbreaker In "My Gal Sal" Due At Quilna

### Betty Grable Is In Cast Of Lyric Feature While Powell And Skelton Hold Deck In "Ship Ahoy" At Ohio

Singing, dancing, romancing red-headed Rita Hayworth is the heartbreaker of "My Gal Sal," scheduled to commence with a review showing Wednesday at the Quilna theatre. Victor Mature plays the role of a song writer, while others who appear in the cast include John Sutton, Carole Landis, James Gleason, Phil Silvers and Walter Catlett. Showing for the last times Wednesday are "The Night Before the Divorce" and "On the Sunny Side."

The Mature-Landis combination also appears in the Lyric film, "Hot Spot," with Betty Grable as one-third of the starring squad. This concerns the efforts of a playboy to make a waitress into a glamor girl, then proceeds to fall in love with her sister. 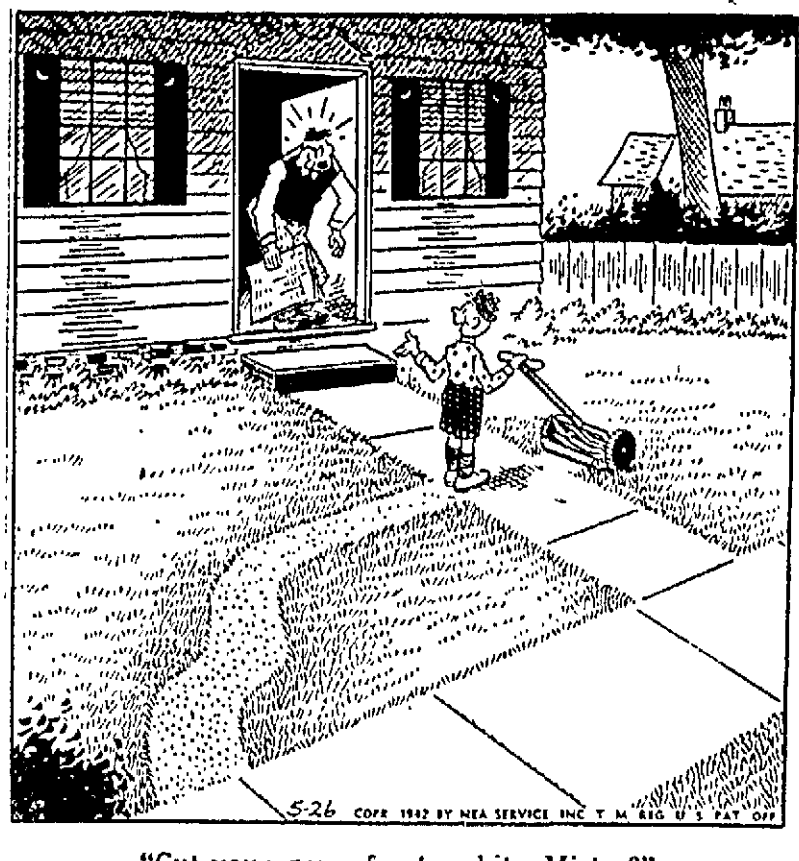

### Real Indian Chief To Be Heard On Horace Heidt's Program Broadcast From Oklahoma City

Walter Huston, veteran character actor of the stage and films, will return for a second guest appearance on the comedy-variety show, Tuesday at 8:30 p. m. over WJZ.

Helping emcee Milton Berle to keep things humming in a light vein will be songstress Shirley Ross, Hob Crosby and announcer Wendell Niles.

A real Indian chief will be one of the unusual guests on the Horace Heidt "Treasure Chest" program from Oklahoma City Tuesday at 8:30 p. m., over WJZ.

He is Albert Atoekni, a Comanche Indian who lives in Apache, Okla., and he has promised to make Heidt an honorary member of the tribe if the band-leader can learn their tribal dance. Others on the program include Frank Trosper, 70, who was one of the first persons to enter the state of Oklahoma when the territory was opened in 1889.

## Van Wert Gas Concern Sale Is Completed

VAN WERT, May 26—The Lake Shore Gas Co.'s artificial gas plant and distribution system has been sold to The Central States Gas Co., Inc.

J. F. Arnold of Ft. Wayne, his son J. Travers Arnold of Paulding and John Dehner of Ft. Wayne are the organizers of the purchasing company. They have been active in the operation of the Central States concern for several years. This concern has franchises in Paulding, Antwerp and Payne, where natural gas is supplied.

Sale price of the property as approved by the Ohio Public Utilities commission was announced at \$43,000 plus the net additions to the property since Feb. 1, 1942, not exceeding \$2,000. The purchasing concern has been authorized to issue 100 shares of no-par common stock to be sold at \$430 per share and to issue 14 promissory notes to the Lake Shore company, 13 for \$2,500 each and one for \$2,500 plus costs of improvements.

## SPEEDIER BOAT TO BE SOUGHT FOR ST. MARYS

### Double Drowning Brings Renewed Demand Of State For Lake Craft

ST. MARYS, May 26—Efforts to get a state patrol boat at the state office, Lake St. Marys, will be redoubled by the Western Ohio Fish and Game-men since the tragic accident last Saturday night in which two local youths, Stafford Noble, Jr., and George K. Loshier, Jr., both 19 years old, were drowned.

Directors of the association sent a letter April 14 to the chief of inland lakes and parks of Ohio, W. R. Wheelock, asking for a patrol boat to replace the one which was moved from St. Marys to another of the state's lakes. A near-fatality was cited by the directors, the lake superintendent, John Sunderland and his assistant, M. A. Durbin, having attempted a rescue with the slow, power boat brought here from Lake Erie not long before. They arrived at the scene after the arrival of another smul-thrown out of their capsized boat.

Saturday night Sunderland left the state office in a borrowed speedboat. The motor failed. He changed to the slow boat sent here to tow the dredge to different parts of the lake and arrived at the scene after the two youths had gone down.

They had left their capsized sail boat and began swimming toward shore from the boat, out about 100 yards off land. They were about half way to the shore when they apparently were seized with cramps and went down.

Double funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at the Methodist church.
