"The American way of life means we must all join in licking

our enemies and licking them to stay licked." His statement came a few days after Pres. Roosevelt and Secretary the league leadership. The YMCA of State Cordell Hull admonished Americans not to be ever-optimis lic-that it probably would be a

long war. Connally said he felt "absolutely certain of victory" but that we must "complete our preparations." Factors in favor of the United Nations, he added, are mounting rapidly.

"Russia is fighting magnificently and the morale of our people is mounting," he said.


