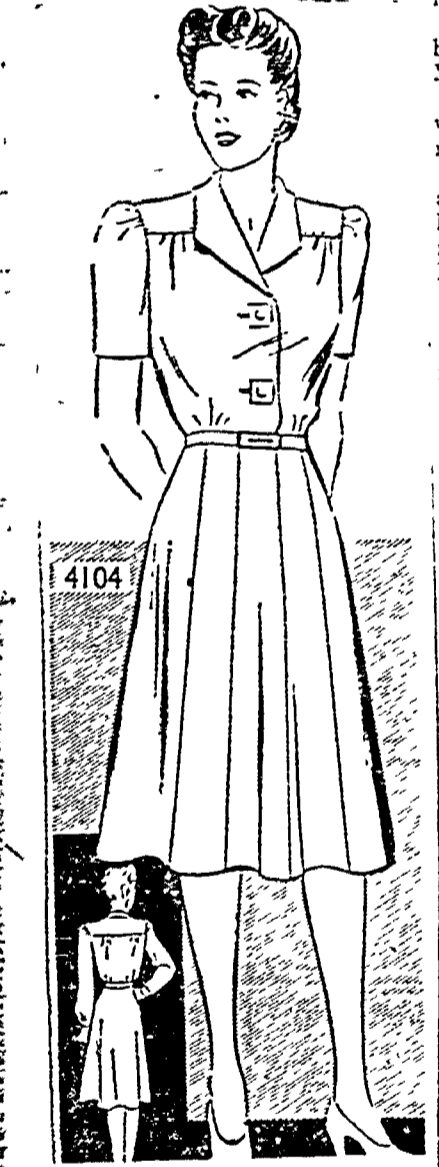

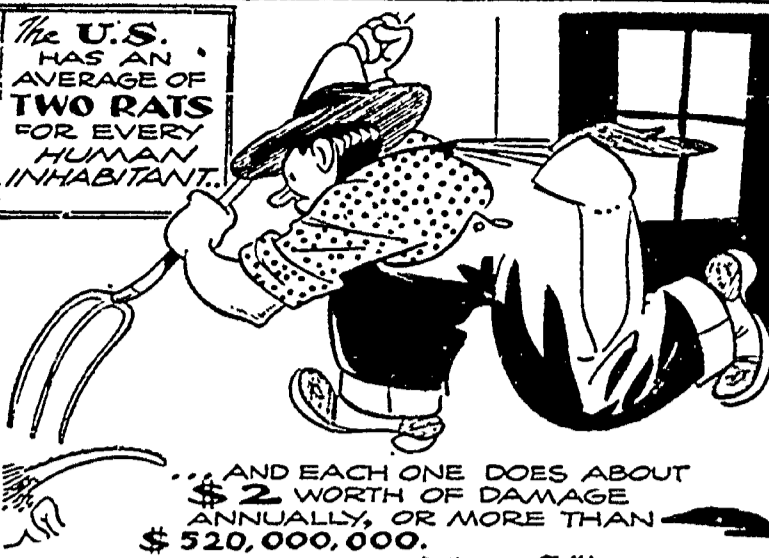

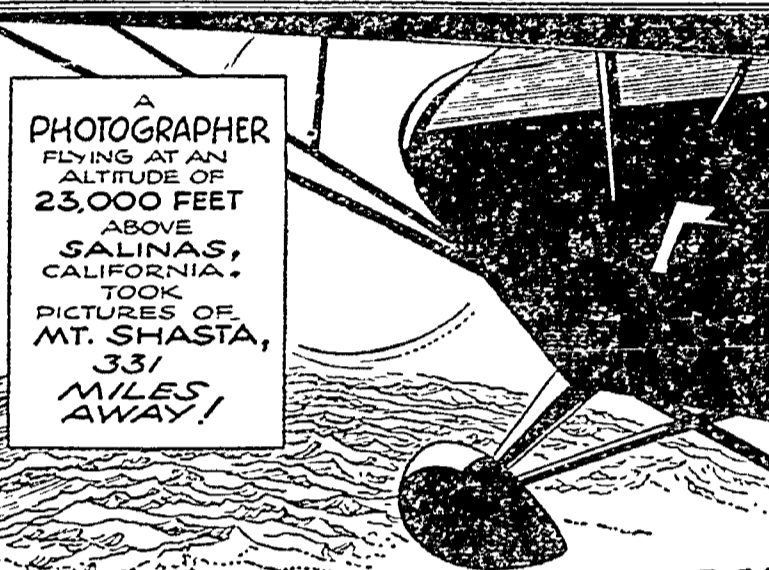

EXPLORER SAYS IGLOO IS FOREIGN TO ALASKA

PORTLAND, Ore., May 27 — (UP)—Contrary to common belief, virtually no igloos are built of ice in Alaska. Amos Burg, Portland explorer, returned home after living a month with the Eskimos and reported that igloos are in reality holes dug in the frozen ground and covered with brush, driftwood and tundra sod. "The much cartooned ice igloos," he explained, "are found further east in King William Land and Greenland." Burg covered 6,000 miles on his Alaska trip, and took 20,000 feet of motion picture film for educational pictures. The aluminum in 125 big juke boxes is enough for one fighter airplane.

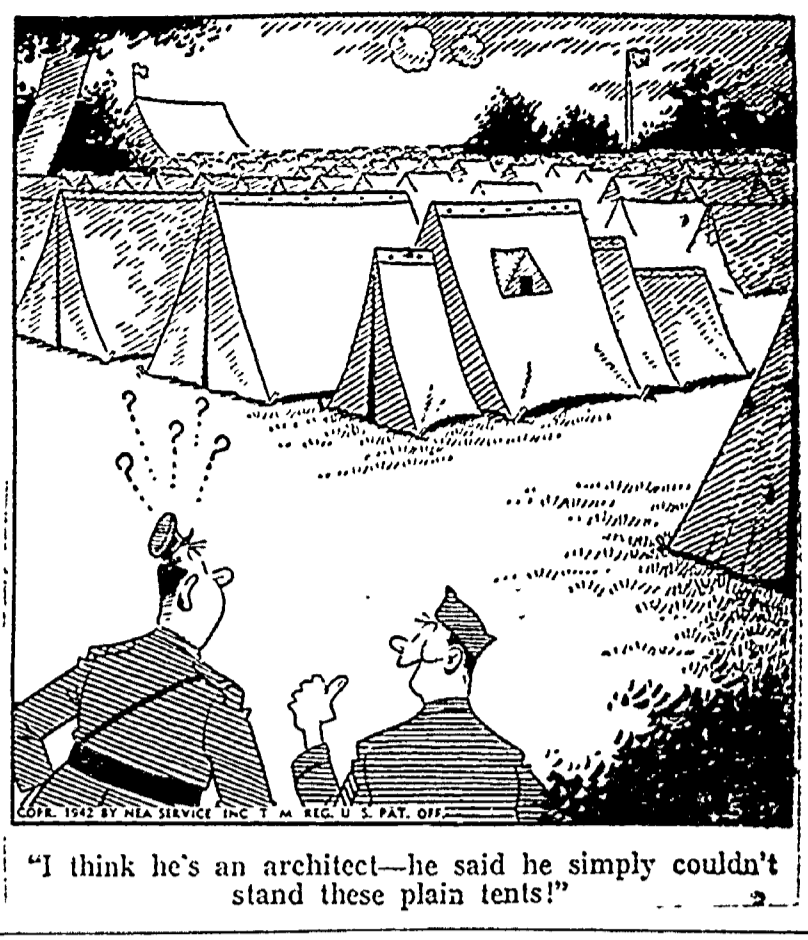
