## Ruth Hussey And Frank McHugh Will Swap Fast Talk With Crooner; Joan And Rudy To Do Circus Play

Crooner Bing Crosby will play host to Ruth Hussey and Frank McHugh of the films and Dave Friedman, national badminton champion, in the Music Hall Thursday at 9 p. m. over WEAF.

The regulars of the hall—Mary Martin, Victor Borge, Ken Carpenter, the Music Maids and Hal and John Scott Trotter and his bandmen—will be on hand with their usual contributions to the show.

Circus sounds will ride the airwaves as Rudy Vallee and Joan Davis cavort thru their play of the week, titled "The Big Top," Thursday, over WEAF at 10 p. m.

Rudy sings "Daring Young Man on the Flying Trapeze," a tuneful ballad which he helped make popular years ago.

Alfred Wallenstein conducts the American Opera Festival orchestra. "Tennessee's Partner" is based on a Bret Harte short story and written in operatic form by Quinto Maganini, who is a Californian.

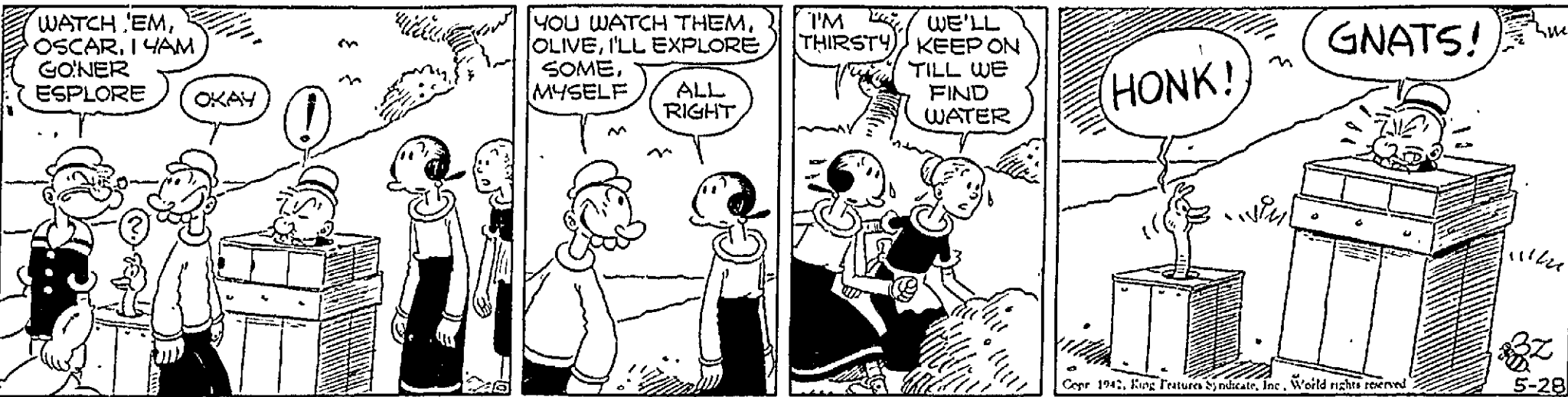
## COMMUNITY HAS \$129,000 FUND

# Lima Area Communities Plan Memorial Rituals

## Congressman Jones Will Speak At St. Marys, Macedon; Band Music, Parades To Feature Many Commemorative Events

Communities thruout the Lima area will pause Saturday to pay the war dead appropriate homage and tribute to those men now serving with America's armed forces at home and abroad.

Programs are varied but in each instance this Memorial Day will mean much to thousands of persons whose relatives now are serving their country.

Individual programs follow: CONGRESSMAN JONES WILL BE SPEAKER ST. MARYS, May 28.—Congressman Robert F. Jones will deliver the address here at the Memorial Day services Saturday at Elm Grove cemetery. He will come from Washington, D. C., to deliver the message at the special services arranged to honor the soldier-dead of this community.

Preceding the service in front of the chapel at the cemetery there will be a parade in which all citizens have been invited to participate. Parents of more than 200 boys from St. Marys and vicinity who are in the armed forces of the United States have been asked to join in the parade this Memorial day. They will meet at the high school at 9:15 a. m. Saturday morning.

ATTORNEY MYERS WILL GIVE ADDRESS CELINA, May 28.—Attorney B. A. Myers will deliver the Memorial day address here Saturday in connection with services which are being arranged by the American Legion auxiliary, Woman's Relief corps and Sons of American Legion.

The parade, including the combined bands of the Celina schools will form at the courthouse at 11:00 o'clock and will move to City park on the north shore of Grand lake where the Woman's Relief corps will conduct services. The parade will then return to the courthouse for the concluding services and the Memorial day address by Attorney Myers.
