Council to See Beer, Liquor Applicants All beer and liquor license applications will be given a "going over" by the council license and ordinance committee next week. Ald. Harrison L. Garner, 13th ward, committee chairman, said today that a final report on the applications must be placed before the common council at its June 12 meeting.

When the committee meets Edg. Commissioner Gordon E. Nelson and Chief of Police William H. McCormick will report on their inspection of all taverns and other places where beer and liquor are sold. If any tavern-keepers are violating the health or sanitary regulations they will be brought before the committee for an explanation. In former years the council approved licenses at its last June meeting but under a law enacted by the last legislature final council action must be taken not later than June 15.
