

Medley Of Patriotic Airs To Be Featured On Program

Lucille Manners, Ross Graham And Chorus And Orchestra Will Join Forces On Broadcast At 8 P. M. Friday

"Songs for Memorial Day," a medley of patriotic airs specially arranged by Dr. Frank Black, the program's conductor, is to be the highlight of the concert Friday at 8 p. m. over WEA.
