Program Going Off The Air Until Oct. 4; Laird Cregar, Gigantic Actor, Set As Guest Of Charlie McCarthy

Jack Benny and his gang present the final program in their 1941-42 series of broadcasts Sunday, broadcasting from Hollywood's radio city over WEAF at 7 p. m. The Waukegan funster will vacation from the air until Oct. 4, next, when he will return at the same time and over the same stations. The sponsor will not present a summer replacement series.

C., who was a musical comedy singer before he entered the United States Army, is the sixth and final "Singer in uniform" to appear on the "Hour of Charm." He will be heard with Phil Spitalny's all-girl orchestra and choir on the program to be broadcast on Sunday, at 10 p. m., over WEAF from an undisclosed point on the eastern seaboard Bill Stern, sports reporter, will broadcast an eye-witness description of an anti-aircraft weapons in action during the War Department-sponsored "Army Hour" Sunday, at 3:30 p. m., over WEAF.

Book Reviews

Obtained At The Lima Public Books Reviewed Here May Be Library, Main Library

VALIANT DUST. By Margaret Mackenzie Mackay—John Day Company, \$2.75.

Tientsin of 1880 and 1890 was a strange composite of races, customs and exotic personalities. And in the foxer siege these people and philosophies were tossed together into a common cauldron. These years in China are seen in this novel thru the story of a young Scottish girl, who went out to Tientsin to marry the sweet heart who had gone out earlier to found their fortunes.

This is an exciting novel giving a colorful picture of a striking chapter in history.

PIED PIPER. By Nevil Shute Norway, William Morrow and Company, \$2.50.

This is something quite different in a war story. The conflict is entirely subordinated to a lovable character, John Howard, who had gone on a fishing trip in the Jura mountains in an attempt to forget his grief over the death of his son. On the day the Germans crossed the Seine into France, Howard started home taking two little English children with him. After incredible difficulties his little party of children increased to seven. The climax of the story is superbly handled.

UNKNOWN COUNTRY. Bruce Hutchinson, Coward-McCann and Company, \$3.50.

Written by a distinguished Canadian journalist who is an authority on Canadian affairs. He loves his native land, but he also has the conviction that no one really knows the potentialities of the vast Dominion or the strength

and complexities of its citizenry. In clear cut prose he has painted a revealing and authentic picture of his homeland. From it Americans can learn much of Canada and her people.

NEW HOPE. By Ruth Suckow, Farrar and Rinehart, \$2.50.

A story of a young Methodist minister's two-years pastorate in a small midwestern town in the early twentieth century. Two of the leading figures in the story are children, the minister's little daughter, Delight, and young Clarence Miller, her "almost twin" in age and size. These two children are as real and living as any pre-adolescents who ever played, dreamed, quarreled, whined, and staked between the covers of a book. The cheerfulness and warmth of the book are achieved inoffensively and honestly.

PRAYER. By George Arthur Buttrick, Abingdon-Cokesbury, \$2.75.

It is something of an event in the religious field to have published a book like this one on prayer by Dr. Buttrick. The he is pastor of a large church and busy with parish duties, he has written a really great book. The book includes every aspect of prayer and its thought is deep-going. It is full of apt quotations and quotable sentences, and is truly a remarkable book.
