"Suspicion" Stars Cary Grant And Joan Fontaine; "Joe Smith, American," Will Be Second Film On Bill

The doubt that separates man and wife and complete absence of doubt in the superiority of the American way of life characterize the film presentations Thursday at the State theatre.

The first "doubtful" theme is exemplified in "Suspicion" starring Cary Grant and Joan Fontaine. The incomparable Alfred Hitchcock directed. Second exhibit is "Joe Smith, American" a fine piece of film work.

Next time Carole Landis bet whether Victor Mature can play a piano she's going to want the piano and six points—or anyway, six keys.

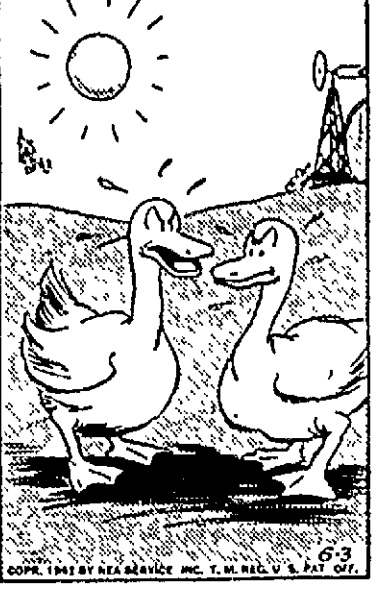
