Ohio Booking Change Puts "Juke Girl" With Ann Sheridan In Title Role On Screen Friday Instead Of Saturday

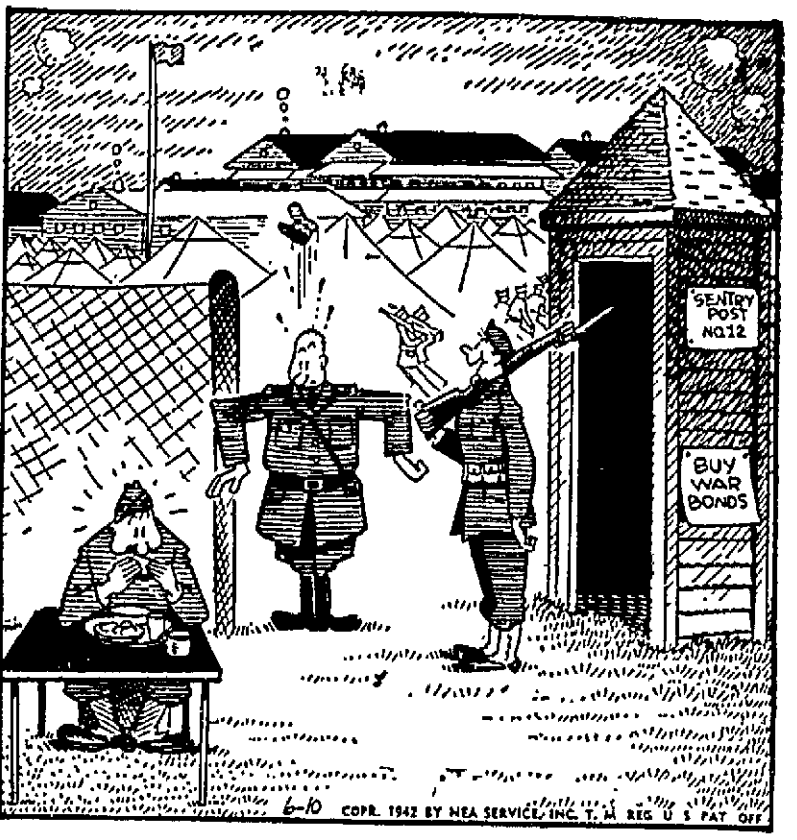
