

Ann Sheridan, Ronald Regan Co-Star In New Ohio Film

"Juke Girl" To Open On Friday; Quilna Offering "Adventures Of Martin Eden" And "Sweetheart Of The Fleet"

Ronald Reagan and Ann Sheridan are the stars of the fast-paced film, "Juke Girl," which commences Friday at the Ohio theatre. The picture tells the dramatic story of a group of hard-bitten fruit pickers in a small Florida town, with Miss Sheridan as the hostess in the local "juke joint," Richard Whorf, George Tobias, Alan Hale and Gene Lockhart appear in prominent roles. Showing for the last times Thursday is "Tortilla Flat," starring Spencer Tracy, Hedy Lamarr and John Garfield.

The Quilna films, "Adventures of Martin Eden" and "Sweetheart of the Fleet," are proving to be popular with the patrons desiring adventure and comedy. The first-named, based on a Jack London story, stars Glenn Ford, Claire Trevor, Stuart Erwin and Evelyn Keyes. In the second attraction are Joan Davis, Joan Woodbury and Jinx Falkenberg. Starting Friday evening are "Wife Takes a Flyer" and "Tramp, Tramp, Tramp."

A story based on the life of Franz Schubert is provided in "New Wine," the State theatre film starring Ilona Massey, Alan Curtis and Binnie Barnes. Also showing is a glittering bit of excitement called "Bombay Clipper," starring William Gaigian and Irene Hervey.

A highly dramatic story is told in "Man With Two Lives," currently at the Lyric theatre with Edward Norris in the starring role. He portrays a man with a strange dual identity. Also on the bill is "Prairie Stranger," the story of a two-fisted, hard-hitting frontier doctor, with Charles Starrett in the starring role.

"I Was Framed," action drama of a fighting reporter who insists on exposing a group of politicians, is currently at the Sigma theatre with Michael Ames and Julie Bishop in the leading roles. Also showing is "Always in My Heart," introducing the singing voice of Gloria Warren, who receives ample support from Walter Huston and Kay Francis.

A lusty action drama that combines breezy dialogue and torrid romance, makes its local debut at the Ohio theatre where "Juke Girl" starts its run. "Juke Girl" has an exciting story to tell, and tells it well, making every line of dialogue, every bit of action, contribute directly to the stark plot.
