LONDON -(U.P)- Throughout the Allied world governments and people took time out today for a week-end of celebrations linked with the United States victory over Japan in the battle of Midway island.

Australia celebrated today as MacArthur Day, in observance of the 43d anniversary of the enrollment of Gen. Douglas Mac-Arthur at the United States military academy. Sunday the Allied nations will

celebrate, with parades, receptions, dances and church services, the first United Nations day, Leaders Send Messages

Messages came from leaders, military and civil, in many countries. In Australia, MacArthur said


