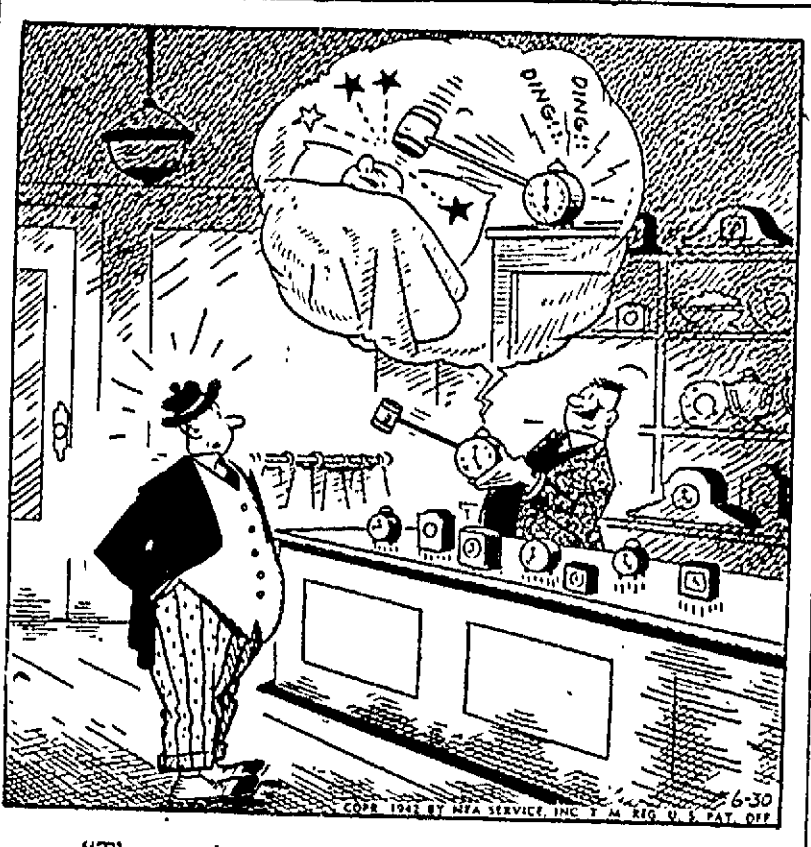

CITY WORKERS ASK PAY JUMP

ST. MARYS, June 30—Twenty dollars increase in pay per month has been petitioned for by the firemen and policemen of St. Marys. The petitions were referred to the finance committee of the city council.
