COUNTY FIFTH IN DRIVE FOR USED RUBBER Allen counties in the state-wide scrap rubber salvage campaign, with an aggregate collection of 441,435 pounds at filling stations from June 15 to July 1, it was announced Friday by Robert G. Weible, executive secretary of the general salvage program.

This county was surpassed only by Cuyahoga, Hamilton, Franklin and Montgomery cos. Six counties in the Lima district contributed 1,107,320 pounds toward the campaign's total. Besides Allen-co's 441,435 pounds, other area contributions included Auglaize, 125,000 pounds; Drake, 175,000; Hancock, 125,000; Hardin, 125,000; and Mercer, 115,594.
