CHICAGO.—(U.P.)—Pete Appleton, a pitcher who has seen 16 years of service in professional baseball, today awaited a call to military service.

He was released unconditionally Sunday by the Chicago White Sox where he had been a relief hurler for two and a half years. He had lost three and won none this year.

Appleton, 37, whose major league record with Cincinnati, Boston Red Sox, Cleveland, New York Yankees, and the White Sox was 55 victories and 65 losses, said that he had taken a physical examination recently and expected to be called soon for military duty.
