Boy Was Thrown Off Threshing Wagon, Wheel Passes Over Head

(Lima News Bureau) NEW KNOXVILLE, July 10-Marvin W. Eversman, 14, son of Mr. and Mrs. Wesley Eversman, of one and one-half miles southeast of here in Shelbye-co, died almost instantly shortly after noon Thursday from a basal fracture of the skull received when he fell from the front of a load of wheat, falling beneath the right front wheel which passed over his

He is believed to have been dead when other members of the threshing crew reached him. The attending physician announced that death was almost instantancous from a basal fracture of the The accident occurred on his father's farm. The wagon is believed to have lurched when striking a rut, throwing the youth to the ground.

Marvin was a member of First Evangelical and Reformed church themselves. and attended New Knoxville high school where he would have been a sophomore during the coming school term

His death marked the first threshing fatality in this com-munity in more than a decade. 
