Gandhi Rejects **British Pledges** Insists Independence

Is Needed at Once

LONDON -(U.P)- Mohandas K. Gandhi said Saturday that he could not accept British promises of post-war indpendence for India, even if supported by guarantees of the Allied nations, Exchange Telegraph agency reported from Calcutta.

In reply to a question whether he would be satisfied with a joint guarantee from the United States, China, and Russia for cancellation of a possible civil disobedience campaign, Gandhi said that the All-India congress would not "contemplate" any guarantee "because the present delivery of independ-ence is the need of the hour." India does not distrust promises

of future independence, he point-ed out, but "India as an independent power wants, if at all possible, to play a decisive part in favor of


