

Judy Canova To Appear As Guest Star On Hobby Program

Outstanding Orchestras Plan Tribute To Berlin During Broadcast Over WJZ Network On Tuesday Night

Judy Canova, the farmer's gift to Hollywood, will be a guest star on Dave Elman's "Hobby Lobby" program, Tuesday, at 8:30 p. m. over WAAC. Originally scheduled to appear on an earlier broadcast, Miss Canova was unable to keep the date because of illness.

Among the other interesting hobbyists scheduled are a man who plays startling music on home-made instruments; a merchant who collects amazing, little-known facts about the game of chess; and a radio executive who records the amusing "fluffs" made by radio announcers.

Johnny Valente, of Maspeth, Long Island, makes his own musical instruments to suit his moods. His strange collection includes two tin cans played as a guitar; a tire pump instrument and many other amusing musical gadgets.

Irving Chernov, a paper merchant from Brooklyn, has uncovered some remarkable, little-known facts about the game of chess. His data goes back to the ancient times when game was first conceived.

A. L. Simon, of New York City, began collecting radio fluffs when he first heard a famous radio announcer miff his lines. He will air some of the more comical examples during his appearance.

Combining a tribute to America's songwriting genius and a preview of his latest works, ray, new hit tunes from the Irving Berlin musical, "Holiday Inn," will be offered by three of the nation's outstanding orchestras in a "Parade of Bands" over WJZ Tuesday.

Featuring the famed orchestras of Alvin Roy, Harry James and Freddy Martin, the special broadcast will be heard from 9:30 to 10:00 p. m.

Charlie Chaplin Plays Lead Role In State Theatre Film

Clever Comedy On Screen At Quilna With Pictures With An Army Flavor Being Featured At Other Houses

One of those films of which we've often heard father talk, is "The Gold Rush," in which Charlie Chaplin, cinema's first great comedian, is starred. This original silent version, with commentary and music now added, will be the attraction at the Sigma theatre Wednesday. Also on the screen will be "Scotland Yard," while Tuesday's fare includes "My Favorite Spy" and "Dr. Broadway."

"She's in the Army Now," currently at the Lyric theatre, stars Lyle Talbot, Veda Ann Borg, Robert Lowery and Marie Wilson in a story of a military unit of women. Co-featured is "Mata Hari," starring Greta Garbo.

At the State theatre Bette Davis, Olivia de Havilland, George Brent and Dennis Morgan comprise the starring foursome of "In This Our Life," a story of mixed emotions and tangled lives. Also showing is "True to the Army," starring Judy Canova and Ann Miller.

Henry Fonda, Lynn Bari and Don Ameche are the stars of the Quilna film, "The Magnificent Dope," a sprightly comedy concerning one of the world's laziest individuals. Also showing is "Thru Different Eyes," which stars Frank Craven, Mary Howard, June Walker and Donald Woods.

Continuing its run at the Ohio theatre is "Wings for the Eagle," a story of stout-hearted factory workers producing the airplanes for our armed services. Ann Sheridan and Dennis Morgan have the starring roles as workers in the Lockheed plant.

One of the many factors which stand out in the minds of the audience after seeing a Charlie Chaplin picture is that the film invariably closes with the Little Fellow walking away from the camera alone—his pathetically jaunty figure trudging toward the horizon—in the hope of better things to come.

So, the audience leaves the theatre with a lump in its lips but a lump in its throat, for such frustration.

wood males today are passing up sophisticated parts for the chance to play a good substantial dope role. There is ample justification for the trend. Altho mutinee idols, to be sure, still cause the female heart to palpitate, it appears that the country lad whose provincialism makes him easy prey for the screen's meanest heavies, garners all the sympathy. Moreover, when the cluck happens to be handsome as well as help mere commiseration ripens into the warmest affection for him. And not only from the audience but from the girl in the film—which in itself is pretty important.

Henry Fonda was convinced of this after he appeared in "The Lady Eve" as a backward botanist who is taken for a sleigh ride by Barbara Stanwyck (which isn't half bad) and practically everybody else in the picture. His fan mail doubled. Hence, the zeal with which he took the title role in "The Magnificent Dope," now at the Quilna theatre. Fonda is co-starred with Don Ameche and Lynn Bari.

LYRIC
There is much that is definitely inspiring in "She's in the Army," the picture now at the Lyric theatre. Tho the story itself is primarily one of comedy, the background shows the wartime activities of the Women's Ambulance and Defense Corps of America, and the picture carries a high degree of interest on this account.

Lucile Gleason, Veda Ann Borg and Marie Wilson, who play featured roles, are presented as members of this organization of uniformed women trained to work in bombed cities, and all do complete justice to their roles quite aside from the fact that they are demonstrating the carrying out of a grimly patriotic service. The film not only qualifies as an amusing and thrilling entertainment, but at the same time furnishes information which is of value and intense interest to every American.

Briefly, the story concerns a debutante songstress who joins the corps on a bet only to find love and a realization that the service is worthy of her best efforts.

Robert Lowery, Lyle Talbot, Warren Hymer and John Holland handle the male roles in a thoroughly satisfactory manner, and Charlotte Henry, Maxine Leslie and Marcella Phillips round out a very good cast.

"She's in the Army" is a very entertaining picture and, on account of its timely subject matter, a highly important one.
