

Laughton Is Star Of Film Due Thursday At The State

"The Tuttles Of Tahiti" Is Hilarious Comedy; Second Film On Bill Will Be "Murder In The Big House"

The serio-comic experiences into which a Tahitian family is plunged when the black gamecock upon which they've wagered their "all" turns out to be a "Ferdinand" provides the action for "The Tuttles of Tahiti" that comes to the State screen Thursday.

Charles Laughton is starred in this film which is unreelcd at the State along with "Murder in the Big House." Until then the current exposure is "In This Our Life" and "True to the Army."

In something revealingly appropriate to the spirit of the times we find the redoubtable Ann Sheridan giving her all for her country, that is almost all, in "Wings for the Eagle" currently displayed at the Ohio theatre. La Sheridan manages to look lively, if unusual, standing in an airplane assembly line.

Opening this day at the Sigma besides "Scotland Yard" is a revised version of an antique epic, "The Gold Rush." Featured is the supreme ruse of two movieland kingdoms, pathos and high comedy one Charles Chaplin. The picture is just as funny now as it was in the day when Grandpa used to lift me off the old Oak cafe bar and send me toddling down the old Empire theatre "shootin' gallery" aisle.

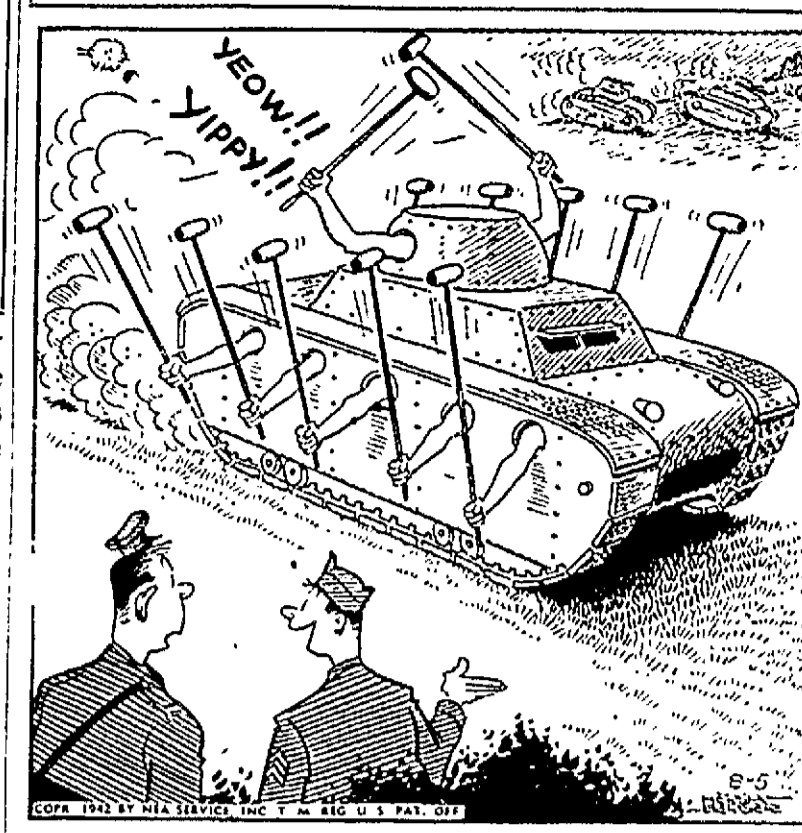

Probate Court Attaches Busy Filing Papers

Activities were brisk Wednesday as numerous papers having to do with various estates had been placed in file in the Allen-co probate court. An inventory and appraisement of the estate of Herbert W. Taylor, late Lima resident, showed total assets of \$8,169.75. They included a 1941 sedan at \$600 and stocks, bonds and securities at \$7,569.75. Lillie M. Taylor is executrix.

Peter J. Backus, late of Delphos, left assets of \$4,249, according to an inventory and appraisement filed by Mae A. Backus, executrix. Accounts and debts receivable amounted to \$229 and real estate \$3,950 including Delphos and Marion-twp. property.

The estate of James I. Heffner, late of Lima, showed assets of \$7,076 in an inventory and appraisement filed by Jennie S. Heffner and George A. Heffner, administrators.
