

# "This Above All" To Open At The Quilna On Friday

### Tyrone Power And Joan Fontaine Have Principal Roles In Eric McKnight's Romantic Story Of Our War Generation

Tyrone Power and Joan Fontaine have the principal roles of "This Above All," Eric McKnight's brave, bold romance of our war generation, which commences a week's run at the Quilna theatre with its showing at the Friday preview. A prominent cast of supporting stars include Thomas Mitchell, Henry Stephenson, Nigel Bruce and Gladys Cooper. Showing for the last time Friday are "The Magnificent Dope" and "Thru Different Eyes."

Currently at the Ohio theatre is a tribute to plane builders, "Wings For The Eagle," with Ann Sheridan and Dennis Morgan in the leading roles. 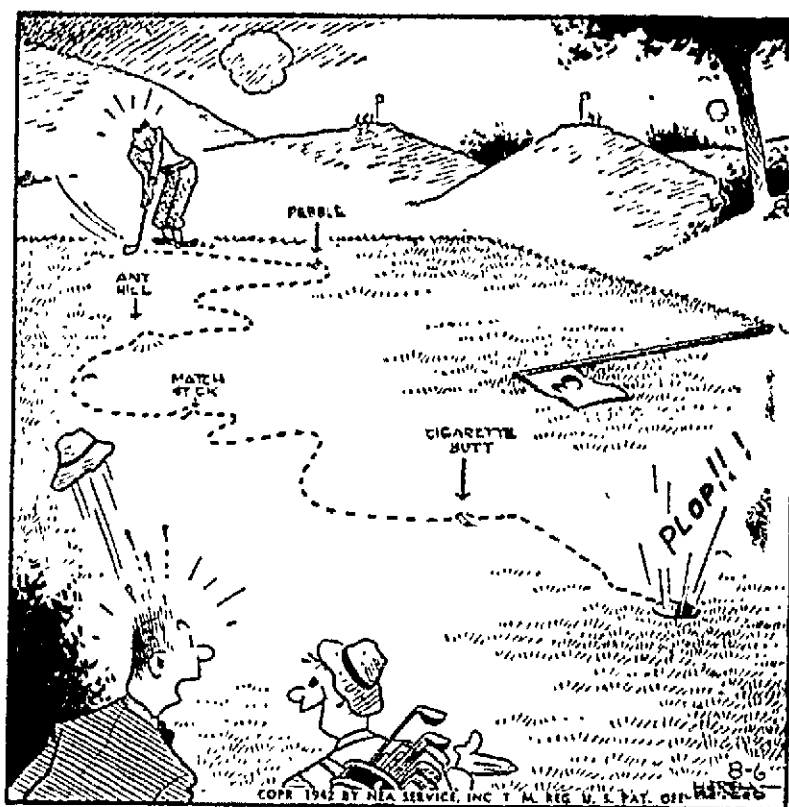
