Nadine Conner will be heard in a solo and the chorus of eight men and four women will join her and Eddy in certain of the songs. Robert Armbruster's Orchestra provides the accompaniments and Bob Garred handles the announcing stint.

He went into a climb, checked his guns and swooped down to destroy another Jap before returning to his base. Later, he bagged two more.

## UNION ORGANIZERS ARE SEEKING COURT REVIEW

COLUMBUS, O., Aug. 12—(UP)—Walter A. Duda and Charles Adams, organizers for the United Construction Workers union convicted in Hancock and sentenced to serve one to three years in the penitentiary on charges of carrying concealed weapons, today appealed to the supreme court for review of their convictions.

Engaged in organizing truck drivers, the two men were arrested when a shot gun, two pistols and

black jacks were found in the automobile in which they were riding. They charged illegal search and prejudicial admission of evidence at their trial, in seeking review.
