Kujawiak Sunk

LONDON (U.P.)—The Polish government announced Friday that the Polish destroyer Kujawiak was lost "a few weeks ago" while carrying out convoy escort duty. In the engagement in which it was sunk the destroyer battled against enemy planes, cruisers, and destroyers which were driven off. Later, however, the Kujawiak sank as a result of an explosion aboard ship.

Sen. Connally Urges Stiff Profits Tax

WASHINGTON (U.P.)—Sen. Tom Connally, (D-Tex.) today advocated a 50 or 60 per cent excess profits tax on individuals as part of the 1942 war revenue bill.

Member of the senate finance committee which Friday completed hearings on the house-approved \$6,270,900,000 tax bill, Connally has been seeking a formula designed to recapture increase earnings which can be attributed to the war.

He urged that a special tax be levied on that part of individual income which is in excess of average earnings for the last five years after deduction of taxes provided in the house bill. These would begin at 19 per cent on the first dollar of taxable income.

Declaring that his plan would apply to "all individuals," he said it was aimed primarily at "contract brokers" whose earnings have been swollen many fold by fees from business concerns for obtaining government war contracts.

Condemned to Die, Little Mongrel Digs His Way to Freedom

WAUKEGAN, Ill. (U.P.)—A black-and-tan mongrel dog whose proposed execution by shooting caused a heated debate between humanitarians and police was a fugitive from the city dog pound today.

The dog, convicted as an "incurable biter," settled the controversy Friday night by digging a hole under the fence of his pen and escaping on the eve of execution.

"The little rascal just dug his way out and I haven't seen him since," said Dog Warden Walter R. Crawford.

Few Cash In on War Bonds, Treasury Says

WASHINGTON (U.P.)—Monthly redemptions of war bonds in the first seven months of this year averaged less than 3.1 per cent of sales, treasury figures disclosed Friday.

Treasury officials called this trend "excellent" and said they saw in the figures arguments against "high pressure" selling.

Ferdinand Kuhn, Jr., assistant to the secretary, said a close check showed that wherever a strong bond-selling campaign was waged, bond redemptions mounted.

"Coercion," Kuhn said, "defeats its own purpose. Wherever bond sales are conducted with normal selling programs, buyers hold on to their bonds very well. But we have found that in the few places where the pressure is put on people to buy, redemptions climb. We don't want coercion."
