Don't Judge Book by Movie, Since Resemblance So Often Appears Only a Coincidence

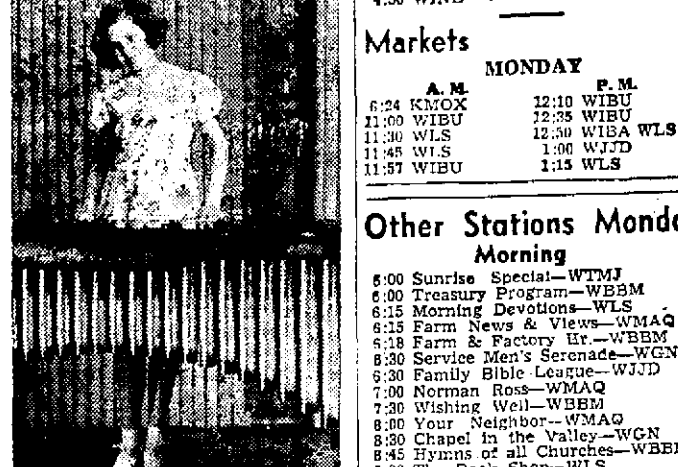
Don't judge a book by its movie only, advises the Madison Free library, where requests for a book to be filmed are often noted long before the movie appears at Madison theaters.

"Mrs. Miniver" for instance, evolved as a well-knit screen story from a book, which like "Penrod" and "Life With Father," is not a novel but a group of short narratives concerned with a central character.

Some Make Fine Movies Hollywood's revisions of prize-winning novels often make excellent movies as in the case of Ellen Glasgow's "In This Our Life," Margaret Mitchell's "Gone With the Wind," and John Steinbeck's "Of Mice and Men."

On the other hand, movie makers are not insensible to the benefits derived from capitalizing on interest in a popular current publication.
