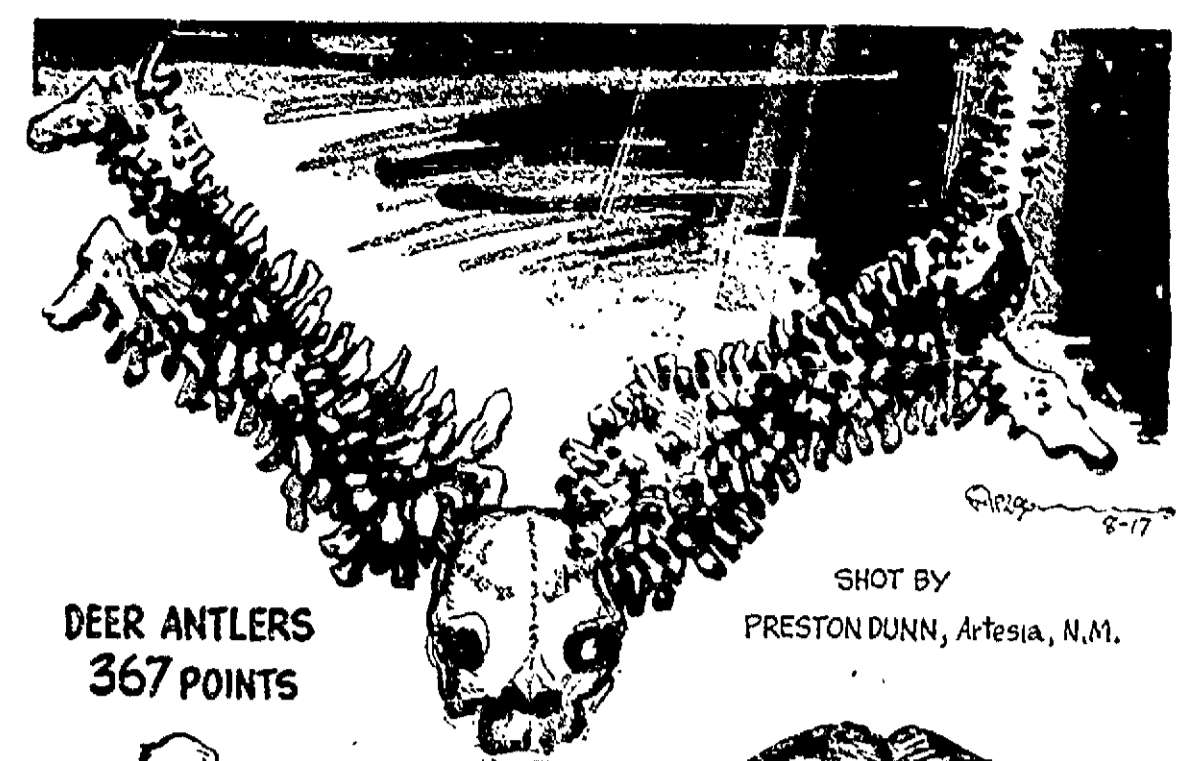

Distinguished Stage And Screen Actor Has Title Role In "Theodore Roosevelt, Man Of Action"

Edward Arnold, distinguished stage and screen star over a long period of years, will play a return engagement on "Cavalcade of America" Monday, in the title role of "Theodore Roosevelt, Man of Action," an exciting drama of a strenuous career, at 8:00 p. m. over WEAF.

Three Presidents of the United States figure in the action: McKinley, Roosevelt and Wilson, Bill Fingley plays McKinley with Dwight Weist as Wilson. Mistress of the most difficult part of being an outstanding singer—that of having an innate control of proper vocal phrasing—is Joan Brooks, "The Lady from the Blue," who starts her second new half-hour show this month over WJZ on Monday, at 9 p. m. She will be accompanied by Joe Kines and his orchestra.

Miss Speaks also sings Kreisler's "Stars in My Eyes," "Gavotte" by Popper and Crist's "Some Day, Some Way," and the orchestra completes the concert with Moszkowski's "Mahnquena" and the "Aragonaise" from Massenet's "Carmen." Alfred Wallenstein conducts.
